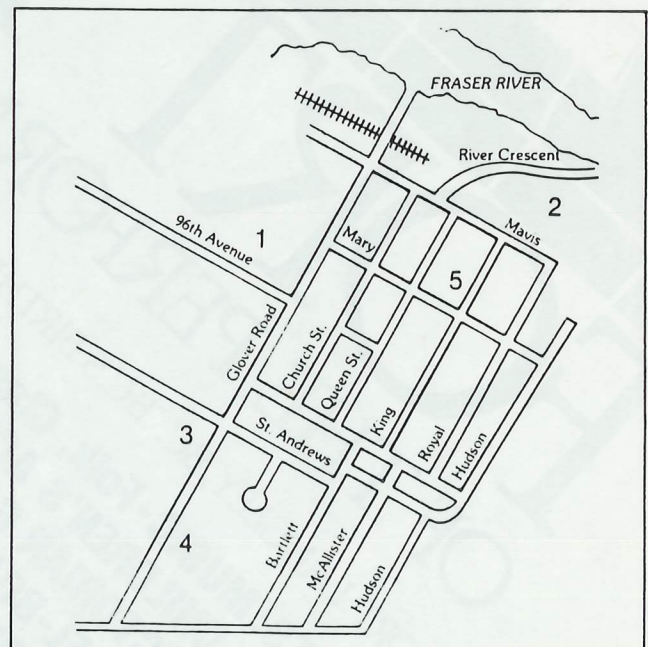

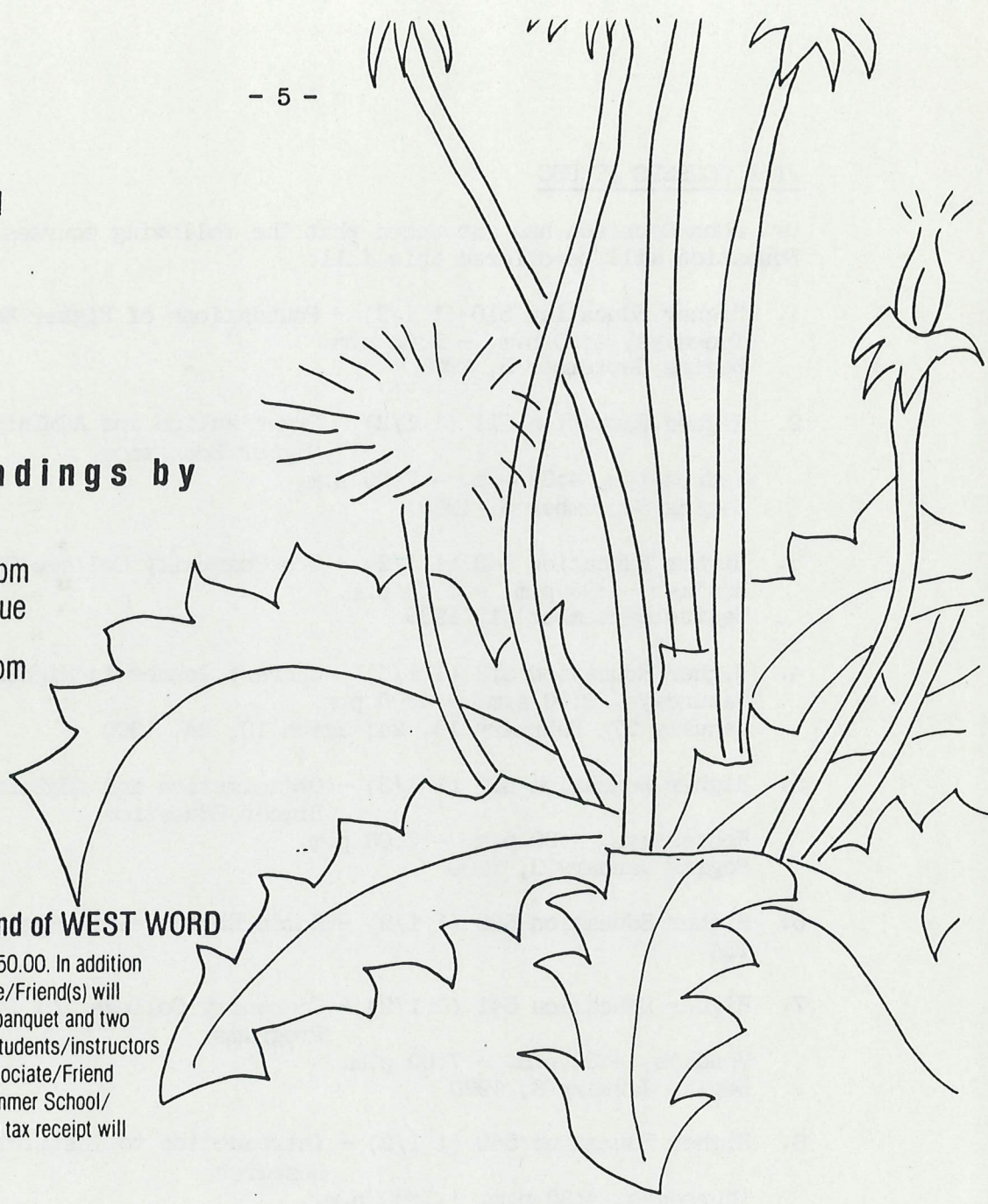

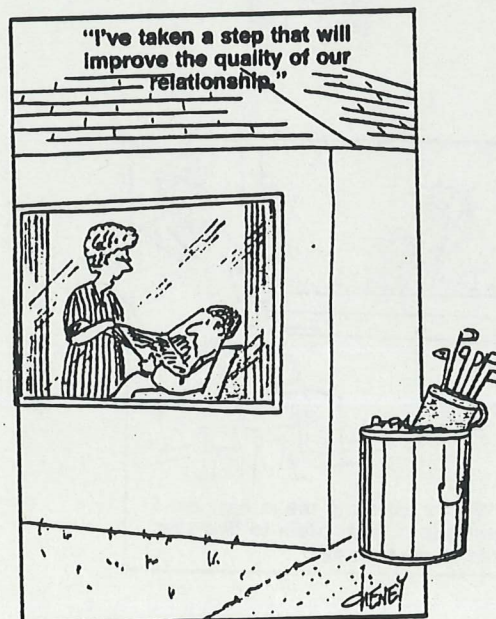
A Master's Degree in a related field is a minimum requirement for this position. A Doctorate is preferred.
