NEWS FROM FINANCIAL AID

I. Good News for Disabled Students!

The funding Ministry has responded positively to our recommendation to make the newly introduced Forgivable Loan Program available to disabled students carrying less than a full load for studies.

Several disabled students taking less than three College Foundations courses at grade 11 or 12 level, for instance, may now apply for forgivable loans of up to \$10,000 a year to cover disability related expenses such as special computer equipment, transportation and restorative devices. Applications are to be submitted through the Special Needs Counsellor. For general information please call Zinnet at Local 720.




