

### WEIGHT WATCHERS AT-WORK PROGRAM

HRD has had many enquiries as to a weight reduction program conducted on campus. As a result, a Weight Watchers representative will begin a "Pilot" 8-week program on September 21/89 at noon to 12:45 if sufficient numbers warrant. At the end of the 8 weeks, the session will simply "renew" for another period if enough people want to continue.

The cost is \$60.00 per participant, payable in advance. We will accept cash, post-dated cheque, Visa and MasterCard. If the required minimum of 25 people is not reached all money will be returned. After the second week of the program, no new members are permitted to join the class. Members who cannot attend their At-Work meeting may simply take their Attendance book and attend any other outside meeting during that week. A schedule of all locations is provided.

The meeting procedure is a weigh-in followed by a meeting of approximately 30 minutes. Employees usually eat their lunch during the meeting time.

### LIBRARY TOURS, ORIENTATIONS AND LAB SESSIONS

The library staff is looking forward to seeing as many KEC students as possible in the library this fall and we ask faculty to book their library tours as soon as possible. For more advanced students, we have developed a program for teaching library skills through the use of library labs. These self-directed labs provide hands-on experience with the microfiche, periodical indexes and the reference collection. We now have over 15 labs on topics ranging from Margaret Atwood to Ancient Greece to Regional Development. As time permits, we can create new labs, specifically tailored to class assignments, making this a very relevant exercise for the students. Unless we get snowed under, we will even mark the labs and return to you to distribute to your students!

We are flexible in introducing these labs, and can begin with a class sessions on bibliographic instruction or a brief library tour; the best approach will be worked out between the instructor and the librarian.

# How much are the bursaries? What are they for?

The value of each bursary ranges from \$30 to \$250, depending on the availability of funds and number of applicants. Students may use their bursary money to meet their unmet financial need, e.g. to pay for their books or busfare.

### Who can apply?

Part-time and full-time KEC students who:

- (1) can demonstrate financial need after they have exhausted all other avenues of financial assistance; and
- (2) are attending classes regularly and progressing satisfactorily in their courses of study.

## When and how can I apply?

Bursary applications are available at both the Financial Aid Office and the Counselling Career Centre in January, May and September. Completed applications should be returned to the Financial Aid Office. The deadline is THE LAST DAY OF JANUARY, MAY AND SEPTEMBER. The results will be given out one month after the deadline.

### WORK-STUDY PROGRAM

### AIMS:

This is a component of B.C.S.A.P., designed to diminish student indebtedness and to meet students' financial needs through employment opportunities on campus.

### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

KEC students who

- 1. are enrolled in full time studies and have maintained a satisfactory scholastic standing;
- 2. are not in default of previous Canada/B.C. Student Loans:
- 3. demonstrate a financial need in excess of their BCSAP or ABESAP award; and
- 4. qualify for B.C. residency.

### HOW TO APPLY?

- 1. In the middle of January, May and September get a work-study application from the Financial Aid Office. Complete and return it to the same office as soon as possible.
- 2. Once your financial need is established, you will be referred to the appropriate departments/offices for job placements. However jobs are only offered to qualified candidates with appropriate skills.

### WHAT KIND OF JOBS AND WHAT IS THE PAY?

Check the job vacancies for Student Aides posted on the noticeboard outside the Financial Aid Office. The job descriptions will give you a general idea of positions available and skills required. The current pay rate is also given on the job descriptions.
