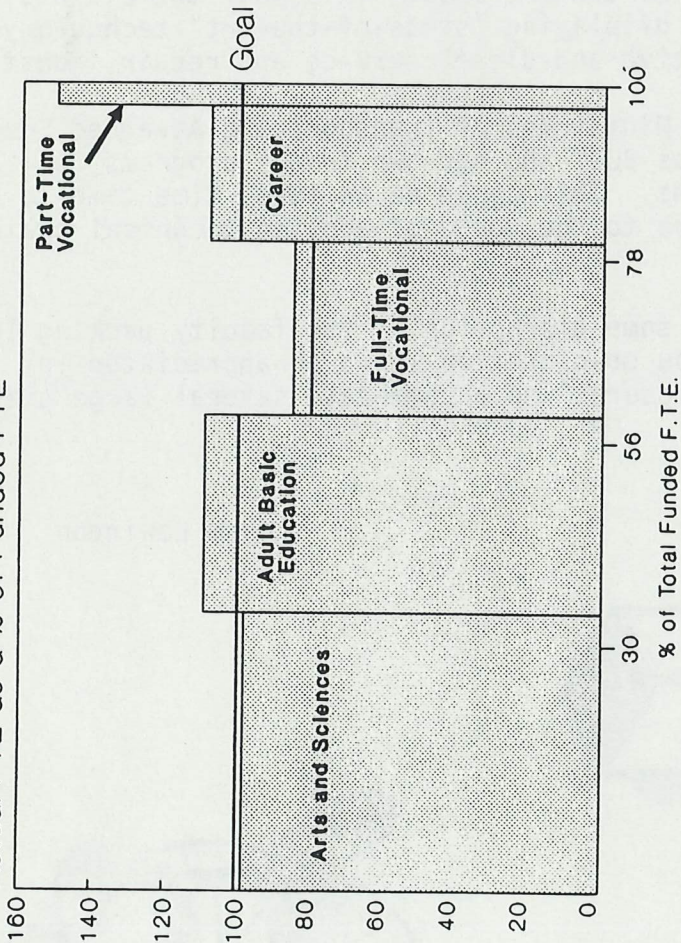

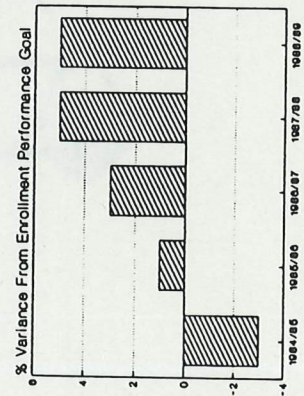

Actual FTE as a % of Funded FTE*



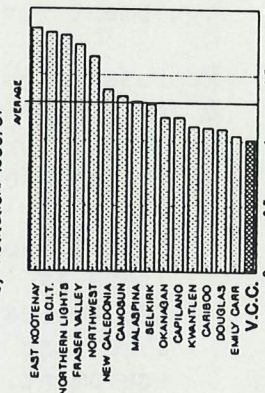

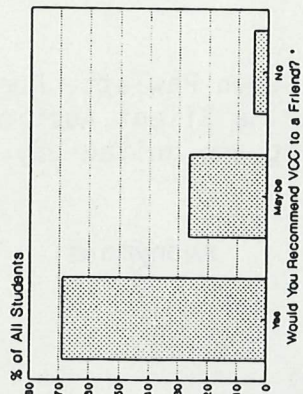

Student Stations per Actual FTE Student by Institution 1986/87

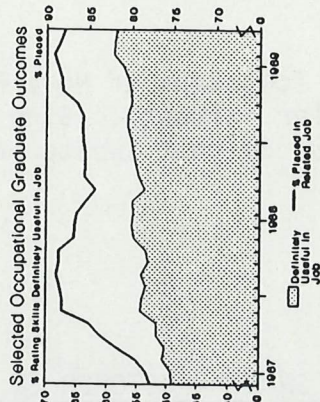

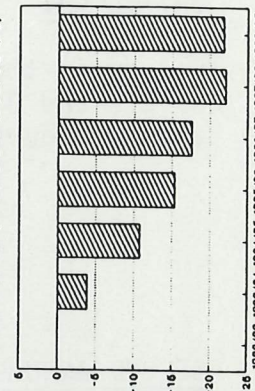

SECOND ANNUAL "TRADE SHOW" - OCTOBER 26 AND 27

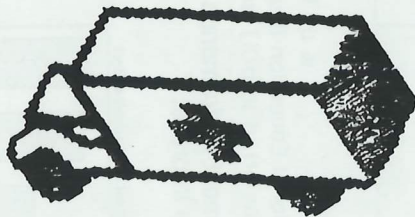

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT NEWS

For those of you thinking about curriculum development in the coming year. here are some important dates to bear in mind.

The approaching budget year (1990-1991) runs from April 01, 1990 through March 31, 1991, and the Curriculum Development Committee is responsible for the allocation of \$80,000 of available funding during that time.

- Stage I:
- Projects planned to be completed between April 01, 1990 and December 31, 1990.
 - Total funds available, approximately \$40,000.
 - Proposals to be submitted to the Curriculum Development Committee Chair in October, November, December 1989. Deadline for submissions is Wednesday, January 17, 1990.
 - Adjudication by mid-February 1990.

- Stage II:
- Projects planned to run between September 1990 and March 31, 1991.
 - Total funds available, approximately \$40,000.
 - Deadline for submissions is mid-May 1990.
 - Adjudication by mid-June 1990.

You've heard about it! You've read about! Some of you have even been there to witness the blessed event of true grit and determination.

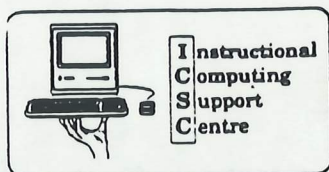
