ANGOTEE: STORY OF AN ESKIMO BOY (31 minutes)

The story of Angotee begins with his birth in the Eastern Arctic in 1953, and shows his childhood and first long trip, his day to day life, and his position within the family. He learns hunting skills from his father, and upon entering manhood shoots his first seal. By the end of the film he himself marries and begins to set up his own household.

ANIMALS IN MOTION (7 minutes)

Between 1877 and 1885, English photographer Eadweard Muybridge conducted detailed experiments in the analysis of human and animal motion by means of rapid photography. In 1968, John Stratton took the published works of Muybridge and created from them a fascinating, charming, hilarious film; a tribute to the maker of the first nudie - long before the invention of the movies.


