Dear Mr. Rerup:

Rumours have been circulating recently about changes to the Instructor's Diploma Program. I feel it is important for everyone to understand what has occurred to avoid any panic by participants or administrators.

First, let me assure you that, although the Ministry intends to withdraw its share of funding, the Instructor's Diploma Program is <u>not</u> <u>being phased out</u>. I.D. will continue to be offered by us at the Centre for Continuing Education, and the Ministry will continue to issue the diploma exclusively on our behalf to all candidates who complete the course requirements.

While the withdrawal of funding is a regrettable decision particularly at a time when vocational education requires more, not less, support from the Ministry, we believe that with your help we can still continue to make a contribution to the professional development of your faculty.

We are examining alternate sources of funding which, obviously, will include fee increases. In addition, we are exploring innovative approaches to deliver courses and, shortly, we will introduce a series of changes which we hope will permit the program to continue with the least disruption to the participants. Our prime objective is to honour our committment to the 1200 candidates currently enrolled in the i.D. program.

Please reassure your faculty that the instructor's Diploma Program will continue to operate and we look forward to your support and encouragement in the future. If you have any questions or suggestions please feel free to contact me at the Centre for Continuing Education (222-5220).
