How much are the bursaries? What are they for?

Bursaries are awarded between \$50. to \$250. The amount depends on the availability of funds and number of applicants. These bursaries are awarded to students who show financial need and who have had unexpected expenses during their educational term. Bursaries cover costs such as medical costs or emergencies.

Who can apply?

Part-time and full-time KEC students who:

- (1) can show financial need after they have used up all other means of financial assistance; and
- (2) are attending classes regularly and doing well in their courses of study.

When and how can I apply?

Bursary applications are available at either the Financial Aid Office or the Counselling Career Centre in January, May and September. Completed applications must be returned to the Financial Aid Office. The deadline is THE LAST DAY OF JANUARY, MAY AND SEPTEMBER.

(Bursaries will be awarded end of February, June and November.)

You are welcome to come on either trip or both. This is a one-day trip leaving at 7:00 in the morning and returning at approximately 6:30 to 7:00 in the evening.

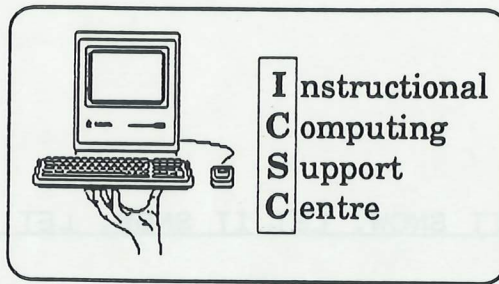
