FINAL P.D. TAR CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The P.D. TAR Committee is now receiving applications from Faculty and Staff for funding to attend conferences and related professional development activities. P.D. FROM THE FINANCIAL AID DEPARTMENT


Sandra North reminds us that the Financial Aid Office has new hours. They are:


EXTENDED HOURS IN THE LEARNING CENTRE
