The following language experience story reflects the feelings of some of the students about the Book Voyage.

CARNEGIE CENTRE - THE BOOK VOYAGE

Yesterday was the first opening of the 1990 Literacy Year. There is a book for other adult learners. The students' own stories will go in the book. Yesterday lots of students talked about learning English, their problems learning to read and write, and their lives. Everybody had different ways of living, but everyone had the same problems. Students from all over the Lower Mainland talked about learning and some people read their own stories or had someone else read them.


