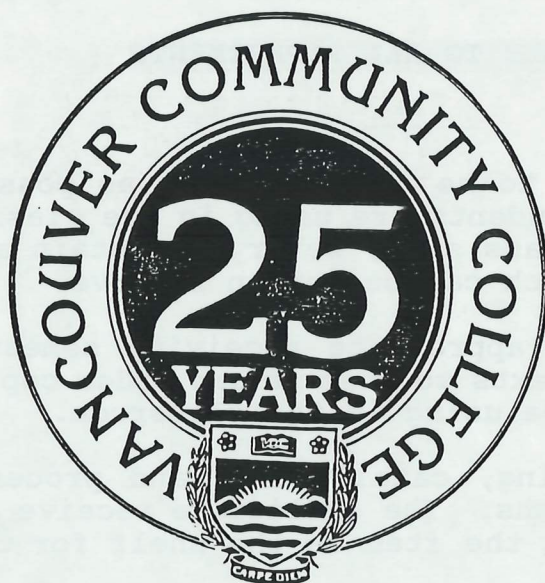

EVENING INSTRUCTORS: LEARNING CENTRE OPEN

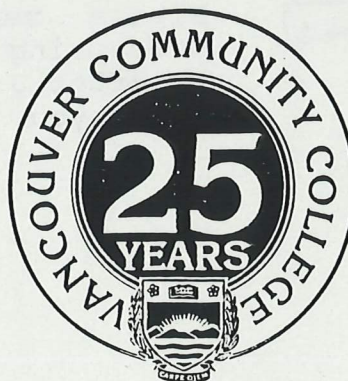

STUDENT LOUNGE

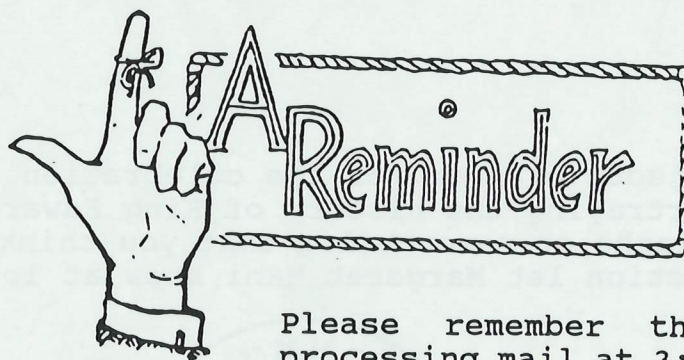
The Student Lounge in the Third Floor will be converted to an office for an ESL Counsellor and the International Education Liaison Instructor.

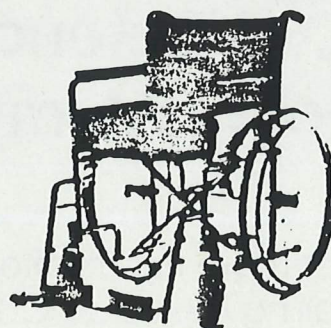

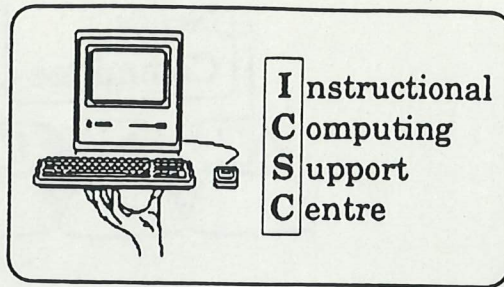

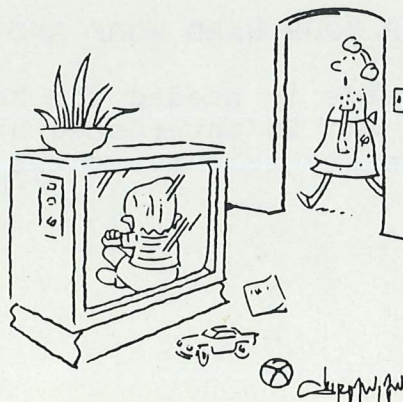
