





ADULT BASIC EDUCATION STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ABESAP)

WHAT IS A.B.E.S.A.P.?

ABESAP is a program funded by the provincial government to provide <u>tuition</u> <u>fees only</u> for needy students. (<u>Maximum of \$360.00 for 4 months of study</u>).

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

You can apply for ABESAP if you are a Canadian citizen, landed immigrant or have refugee status. All students with S.I.N. starting with 900 must show citizenship papers. ABESAP is available for students enrolling in one of the following programs offered at V.C.C.-King Edward Campus:

Basic Education (ABE Foundations)
BEST
BTSD Level 3 (ABE Intermediate)

HOW CAN I APPLY?

One month before registration, you can pick up an ABESAP application from the Financial Aid Office (#4029) or the Counselling Career Centre (#3002).

* RETURNING STUDENTS (green form)

If you are a <u>returning</u> student (have a K.E.C. student number), you must have the teacher's comment section #24 on your application completed before returning your ABESAP application to the Financial Aid Office. <u>Returning</u> students are advised to complete their application as quickly as possible. It takes two weeks to process your application.

* NEW STUDENTS (green form)

If you are a <u>NEW</u> student (no K.E.C. student number), you must register first, pay your fees and <u>get your student number</u>, before you submit your application to the Financial Aid Office (#4029). You do <u>not</u> have to complete section #24 (teacher's comments) on your application form.

* DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION IS ONE MONTH AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES!!!

PLEASE NOTE:

1) ALL full-time students who are being supported by the Ministry of Social Services and housing (welfare) must first apply to MSSH for assistance are have MSSH provide a letter of refusal if they will not pay your tuition fee. Part-time students do not require a letter from MSSH.

What Is It?

The DYNIX library computer system will provide a variety of automated library services. For library users the most important of these services is the on-line public catalogue which will be installed throughout the campus libraries within the next three months.

How Is It Used?

Using the DYNIX system you may locate books, periodicals and audiovisual materials, in a variety of ways including the customary searches by author, title and subject.


What Does It Contain?

The V.C.C. libraries online catalogue contains approximately 120,000 titles. Authors and titles of articles in periodicals are not included.

What are the System's Advantages?

Access and currency: As new books are added to the system this information is immediately available in the public access catalogue. Eventually the system will be linked to a circulation function and provide students, faculty and staff with the status of each item: is it in or out? As well, the faculty will be able to reach the library online catalogue using office terminals (without moving your bot——s!)



BASIC PROOFREADING

Typographical errors are funny only when they appear in <u>someone else's</u> report, letter, memo, newsletter or proposal. Anyone responsible for written material needs to know how to proofread and catch embarrassing errors before they leave one's desk. If you have had no proofreading training or experience, this course will be particularly useful; if you have had some proofreading training or experience, you will find the course a worthwhile refresher.

Topics include: convincing others of the importance of proofreading; budgeting time to proofread effectively; kinds of errors to look for: format errors, spacing errors, wrong levels of headings, missing copy, typographical mistakes, etc.; checking corrections; the process of proofreading: with a partner and on your own; the word processor and proofreading; avoiding common errors of style, punctuation, grammar and spelling.

FACILITATOR Barbara Tomlin, B.A., M.A. in English, has worked as an editor, copy editor and proofreader for 11 years. As both an employee and freelancer she has completed projects for a variety of organizations.
