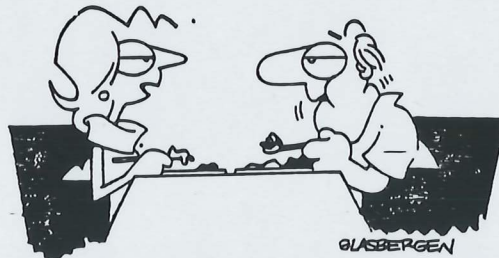

**UPDATED TRAINING PROGRAM ANNOUNCED BY MINISTRY OF ADVANCED
EDUCATION, TRAINING AND TECHNOLOGY**

VICTORIA - Advanced Education, Training and Technology Minister Bruce Strachan announced today that the Training Employment, Science and Technology (TEST) program has received funding approval for an updated program.

This year's TEST program has an expanded range of activities and will assist in funding recent post secondary graduates in the areas of science, technology and related technical support.

The TEST initiative is designed to help recent science and technology graduates obtain meaningful employment in fields which utilize their educational skills, by providing wage subsidies to private sector business.

The program, which is delivered by the Science Council of British Columbia and funded by the province, ran as a pilot program in 1987-88.

"The TEST program is an important initiative that will forge links between education and industry and strengthen the general level of technological expertise in British Columbia's economy," says Strachan.

In 1987-88 TEST supported projects which generated \$1.88 million in new revenue for participating companies. The success of the program is also evident in the 92 percent retention rate of participants after funding was exhausted.

Important program guidelines state that:

- * Potential applicants may not have been employed in positions related to their field of study and must have graduated not less than two months or more than one year prior to employment.
- * Funding is for twelve months and reimbursement is at a rate of sixty percent of wages, up to \$1,500 per month.
- * Preference will be given to employers with fewer than twenty-five employees, although larger companies will not be excluded.

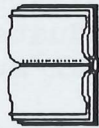
