A WORD FROM THE BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE

Dear Colleagues:

Improving our college environment and enhancing our campus in a comprehensive way, has been a long standing concern and recommendation of The Beautification Committee.

To this end The Beautification Committee has sought professional advice from The School of Architecture, U.B.C. We are familiar with the high standards of design work done by architecture students in their final year under the direction of architecture professors. We also like the idea of creative exchange between our college and U.B.C. for the mutual benefit of both educational communities. We therefore highly recommend this project and invite your participation. After some initial consultation between Ron Walker and Bud Wood, both Professors of Architecture, and Moura Quayle Professor of Landscape Architecture, Bud Wood writes some informal notes about the possibility of our College employing three

or four senior Architecture students to bring forward suggestions and opportunities of enhancing the quality of King Edward Campus places and experiences:

"The work would take place in our school's studio on Granville Island, and would be done under the supervision and guidance of myself and Moura Quayle, Associate Professor of Landscape Architecture. The work would, of course, be conducted in concert with your faculty, staff and student advice and involvement."

The Architecture School sees the design work at, perhaps, three levels:

- 1. Foreground: that which is immediately touchable and "close in", which could be implemented in the short-term and within a modest maintenance budget.
- 2. Middleground: design ideas which would propose rearrangement or re-alignment of activities, spaces to reinforce active casual and formal places. This level of intervention would require some modest capital budget for change.
- 3. Background: to develop alternative visions for development and growth involved for long term planning and expansion.

The Beautification Committee recommends a comprehensive participating, and inductive design approach to a renewed studying of campus and an initial approach to foreground, middleground and Our specific concerns such as softening of background matters. entrance ways, spatial treatment of courtyard and walkways, student cafeteria, building/ground relationships, auditorium improvements, murals, surface/texture treatment and landscaping can thus be given a proper professional approach, encompassing both functional and aesthetic concerns. Other functional and spatial concerns can also be considered at this time and given quality architectural attention.

We are pleased that the college has approved this project. At present I am communicating with Bud Wood and the Granville Studio of the School of Architecture.

I invite faculty and student input and creative participation in this all campus project. The process of input/exchange design work is expected to continue during the summer months and we look forward to creative cooperation at all levels. I can be reached

SUMMER 1990 K.E.C. BURSARIES

Additional financial assistance is provided to deserving KEC students by the King Edward Campus Bursary Fund established through private donations. In recent years bursaries have been provided by the following donors:

How much are the bursaries? What are they for?

Bursaries are awarded between \$50 to \$250. The amount depends on the availability of funds and number of applicants. These bursaries are awarded to students who show financial need and who have had unexpected expenses during their educational term. Bursaries cover costs such as medical costs or emergencies.

Who can apply?

Part-time and full-time students who:

- are registered in courses during the summer at KEC;
- can show financial need after they have used up all other means of financial assistance; and
- are attending classes regularly and doing well in their courses of study.

When and how can I apply?

Bursary applications are available from June 4th to June 29th, 1990 at either the Financial Aid Office or the Counselling Career Centre. applications must be returned to the Financial Aid Office. The deadline for Summer 1990 Bursary applications is Friday, June 29 1990.

(Bursaries will be awarded towards the end of July 1990.)
