POWER PLAY


Basic Education students welcome the faculty of KEC to their POWER PLAY, an example of FORUM THEATRE, directed by the actors of HEADLINES THEATRE.

Due to limited funds, refreshments will be served to students only.





COMPUTER CORNER:

Most people have computer related questions which they seldom get around to having answered when they occur. **Computer Corner** is where we will try to provide the answers to those questions every week. If you have a question, drop it in my mail box and look for the answer in the next week's KEC TIMES.

Question: How do I erase files which I no longer need from my disk?

Answer: To erase files, use the DOS command DEL. For example to erase a file called ESSAY.DOC from your floppy disk: insert the disk in drive A, and at the DOS prompt, type

A> DEL ESSAY.DOC

This file will now be deleted.

Question: I saved my file and it isn't there now. What happenned to it?

Answer: Check the hard disk - C drive - or the disk in drive A or B. It is possible that you saved to the wrong disk. If you are running a program off the hard disk and you save a file, it will save onto the hard disk unless you specify otherwise. To save to the A drive when you are in the hard disk, you include the drive you wish to save to in the file name. For example to save a file called TEST1.MAY to drive A, the file name must be named

A: TEST1. MAY

Of course, you may have deleted the file. Next week, I will discuss how to recover a file which has been accidentally deleted

How much are the bursaries? What are they for?

Bursaries are awarded between \$50 to \$250. The amount depends on the availability of funds and number of applicants. These bursaries are awarded to students who show financial need and who have had unexpected expenses during their educational term. Bursaries cover costs such as medical costs or emergencies.

Who can apply?

Part-time and full-time students who:

- are registered in courses during the summer at KEC;
- can show financial need after they have used up all other means of financial assistance; and
- are attending classes regularly and doing well in their courses of study.

When and how can I apply?

Bursary applications are available from June 4th to June 29th, 1990 at either the Financial Aid Office or the Counselling Career Centre. Completed applications must be returned to the Financial Aid Office. The deadline for Summer 1990 Bursary applications is <u>Friday</u>, June 29 1990.

(Bursaries will be awarded towards the end of July 1990.)
