

WHERE

Department of English, Han Nam University Taejon, South Korea

WHAT

Han Nam University has a student enrolment of about 10,000. There are sixteen faculty members in the Department of English Language and Literature including eight native speakers of English. Recently several courses in English language skills have been offered to non-English majors. This trend promises to continue, with an anticipated need for more English-native - speakers. The class size is limited to twenty. There is a curriculum development plan in progress, which includes cooperation between teachers, especially those involved in the teaching of different sections of the same level. Faculty are encouraged to develop, use and share teaching materials.

SALARY

B.A. 760,000 Korean won per month M.A. 938,000 won per month(11,256,000 won /year).

The basic figure is increased, reflecting experience, and TESL or related qualifications

Required teaching: 12 hours a week

Schedule: about 8 1/2 months a year. (Salary is paid each month for 12 months.)

Contract: one year, renewable.
