



ADULT BASIC EDUCATION STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ABESAP)

WHAT IS A.B.E.S.A.P.?

ABESAP is a program funded by the provincial government to provide <u>tuition fees only</u> for needy students. (Maximum of \$360.00 for 4 months of study). Only one application per term, or 1 application for 4 months of study.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

You can apply for ABESAP if you are a Canadian citizen, landed immigrant or have refugee status. All students with S.I.N. starting with 900 must show citizenship papers. ABESAP is available for students enroling in one of the following programs offered at V.C.C.-King Edward Campus:

- Basic Education (ABE foundations)

HOW CAN I APPLY?

One month before registration date, you can pick up an ABESAP application from the Financial Aid Office (#4029) or the Counselling Career Centre (#3002).

* RETURNING STUDENTS (pink form)

If you are a <u>returning</u> student (have a K.E.C. student number), you must have the teacher's comment section #20 on your application completed before returning your ABESAP application to the Financial Aid Office. <u>Returning</u> students are advised to complete their application as quickly as possible. It takes two weeks to process your application. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* <u>NEW STUDENTS</u> (green form)

If you are a <u>NEW</u> student (no K.E.C. student number), you can submit your application to the Financial Aid Office (#4029). You do <u>not</u> have to complete section #20 (teacher's comments) on your application form. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION IS ONE MONTH AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES

PLEASE NOTE:

1) ALL full-time students who are being supported by the Ministry of Social Services and Housing (welfare) must first apply to MSSH for assistance and have MSSH provide a letter of refusal if they will not pay your tuition fees. Part-time students do <u>not</u> require a letter from MSSH.





Computing Corner

The question most often asked over these past two weeks concerned scanning a picture.

Question: How do I scan a picture?

Answer: On computer #5 select Scanning Gallery from the menu.

- 1. Place your material to be scanned face down on the glass with the top leftcorner next to the orange V
- 2. In the window entitled Scanner, click on Scan
- 3. If your picture is in colour or contains shades of gray, make sure to click on this option.
- 4. Click on OK
- 5. When your picture is displayed in the scanning window:
 Select the part you wish to print by moving the mouse pointer to one corner of the area holding down the left mouse button while moving the pointer to the diagonally opposite corner.

- 6. Select SCAN again
- 7. Select Final Scan
- 8. Adjust Image size when printed to meet your needs-hold down left mouse button on left or right arrow until desired size is reached.
- 9. Click on OK
- Type in the file name of your image using the extension TIF if using Word or .PCX if using WordPerfect eg. A:PHOTO.TIF or A:PHOTO.PCX
- 11. To see the graphic as it will appear on the page, click on VIEW and select Full View or to see more detail select Detail View.
- 12. To quit Scanning Gallery:
 - a) Click on the picture of a disk in the bottom left hand corner of screen
 - b) Click on Close in the menu which appears
 - c) Click on OK


If there is a long wait for any of these options to occur, check that the light is flickering on either the hard or the floppy drive. This merely means that the work is being processed


