Computing Corner

Question:

How do I know which fonts are most appropriate for my word processing

documents?

Answer: You will have a better grasp of fonts if you have an understanding of the basic principles of typography.

The term Typeface refers to the design and style of letters and characters. There are many different typefaces falling broadly into three categories serif, sans serif and specialty.

Serif
letters with short
strokes at the end of the straight line.

Sans Serif
letters have no short strokes at the
end of the straight line

On this page, serif, Times Roman, was chosen for the body of the text and sans serif, Helvetica, for the headings.

The term font refers to the size, width and angle of a character within a certain typeface. Bold fonts have thick dark lines, italic or oblique fonts have slanted lines and light fonts have lighter delicate lines. The examples below are of different fonts within the Times-Roman typeface family.

Font sizes are measured in the number of *points* from the top of the tallest letter to the bottom of the lowest. The body of this article is in Times Roman 12 point. There are 72 points to an inch.

Both the fonts used on this page Times Roman and Helvetica are examples of proportional fonts. This means that wide letters like W and M occupy more space than narrower letters like I and i. In a fixed pitch font eg. Courier, each character occupies the same amount of space.



Fixed pitch fonts like Courier are standard to most word processors, so what you see on the screen is what you get on the page. With proportional fonts, what you see on the screen may resemble Courier but the appearance of the page will be different. Use the *print* -view option to check.

Since the spaces in proportional fonts are not always the same width, it is important that you use the tab key and not the spacebar to tab for columns. If you use the space bar, your columns may appear to be aligned, but you will be surprised to see that they are not so on the page.




