AN AWARD WINNER!

BTSD Math and Science Coordinator, Peter Lear has received a B.C. Asia Pacific Scholars' Award from the B.C. Centre for International Education which is funded by the Ministry of Advanced Education, Training and Technology.

The award will allow Peter to travel to India to present a two-month lecture/workshop series The Mathematics of Chaos Theory and Fractal Geometry at the National College, Bangalore. The National College is a degree granting institution affiliated with the University of Bangalore, Karnataka State, South India. He has also been invited to speak on Chaos theory at the Sir M. Visvesvaraya Institute of Technology (an Engineering College) near Bangalore.

Peter explains the Chaos theory is based on the idea that nothing is completely predictable. It has produced some of the most complicated objects in mathematics as well as some of its most beautiful patterns with many applications in Physics, Biology, Physiology, Meteorology, Electronics, and Communications Theory.

After attending a conference on Mathematics and Computers in New Hampshire at the end of June he will travel directly to India and return to KEC in September.

We look forward to a slide show and report of your trip, Peter.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ABESAP)

WHAT IS A.B.E.S.A.P.?

ABESAP is a program funded by the provincial government to provide grants for tuition fees only for needy students.

Grants are limited!!! Only one application is accepted per term. (Spring term: January -April; Summer term: May -August; Fall term: Sept. - Dec.)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

You can apply for ABESAP if you are a Canadian citizen, landed immigrant, or have refugee status. All students with S.I.N. starting with 900 must show immigration papers. ABESAP grants are available at V.C.C.-King Edward Campus

WHEN CAN I APPLY?

One month before registration, you can pick up an ABESAP application from the Financial Aid Office (#4029) or Counselling (#3002).

* RETURNING STUDENTS

If you are a <u>returning</u> student (have a K.E.C. student number), you must have the teacher's comment section B on your application completed. <u>Returning</u> students are advised to complete their applications as quickly as possible. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* NEW STUDENTS

If you are a <u>NEW</u> student (no K.E.C. student number), you can submit your application to the Financial Aid Office (#4029). You do <u>not</u> have to complete Section B (teacher's comments) on your application form. You can apply one month

before you register !!!

* DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR ABESAP IS 2 WEEKS AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES FOR EACH TERM

PLEASE NOTE:

- supported by MSSH must first apply to MSSH for assistance and have MSSH provide a letter of refusal if they will not pay your tuition fees. Part-time students do not require a letter from MSSH.
- 2) Continued ABESAP funding is dependent on successful academic progress.

Registration is limited to one fee-waiver per computer course at the Oakridge Computer Lab. Please register early to avoid disappointment.



If you do not know your E-mail address, send me your ID and the name of the system that you are using-SFU or UBC. You may send this information electronically, or merely place it in my mail box or Phone Local 776. and leave a message.

SFU X-Change: Anyone who wishes to obtain a User ID at SFU in order to use E-Mailor any of the other services offerred, may do so by completing the SFU X-Change form, which may be obtained from me or at the ICSC, and mailing it to the address indicated. (Do not send \$25.00.) Your User ID will be mailed to you. When this happens, let me know and your name will be added to the Campus E-Mail Directory.

Modem

Access to ERIC is another of the services offerred. If you are a member of the SFU X-Change, you may conduct your own ERIC searches from any computer equipped with a modem.


Public Libraries
