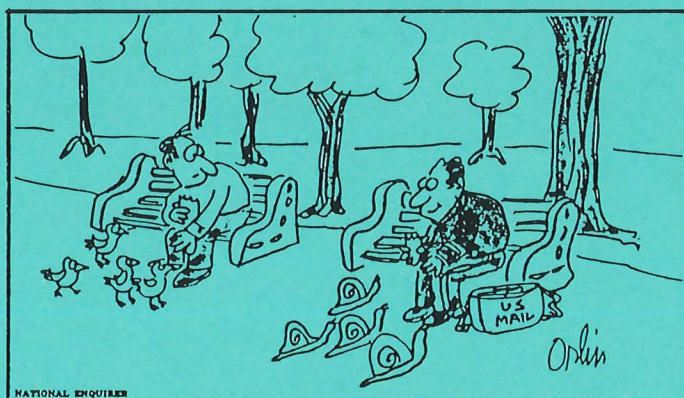

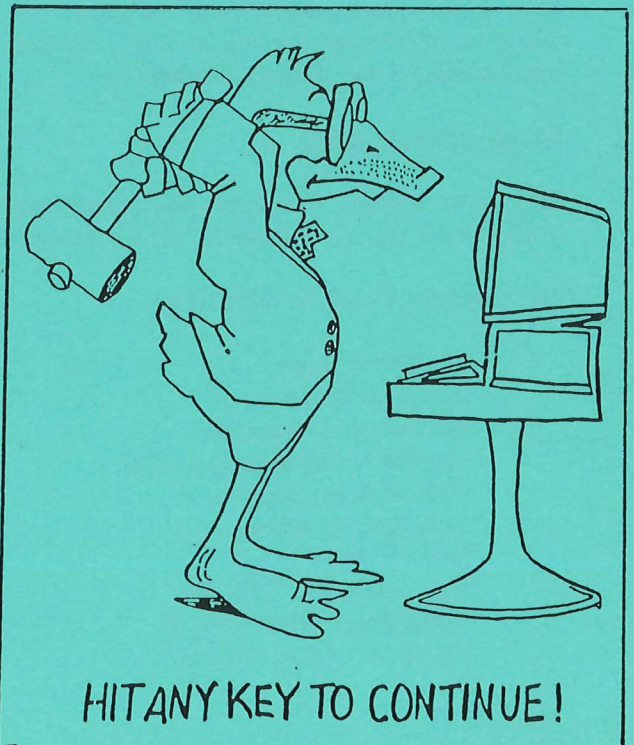
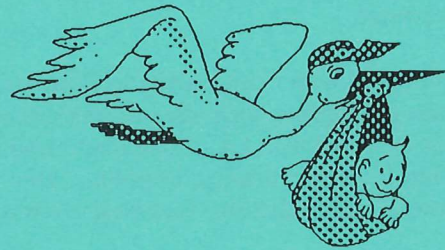

The Association of Canadian Community Colleges, supported by Conestoga College, Humber College and Vancouver Community College anticipates an early approval of three projects in Czechoslovakia. Once the required approvals have been received, an immediate opening will be available.

COORDINATOR/HEAD INSTRUCTOR

Summer Institute for Master Teachers
English as a Second Language

Dates: July 1 - August 25, 1991

Project Description:

This project will assist selected CSFR institutions to strengthen their programs of teaching English as a Second Language. The focus will be on the selection of participants for adequate knowledge of the language, high motivation for excellence in teaching and a demonstrated ability and commitment to leadership in professional development.

It is proposed under this activity to bring six highly trained teachers to CSFR to carry out a six week intensive program of language upgrading and enhancement of teaching methodologies. Two instructors will be attached to each the Akademie J.A. Komenskeho and the Akademia Vzdavania which in turn will cooperate with Czech and Slovak teacher training institutes. One instructor each will be attached to the Institute of Technology in Uherske Hradiste and the Technical University in Liberec.

The CSFR participants may include licensed instructors seeking re-qualification for ESL, ESL head instructors from technical schools and ESL leaders and master teachers. Additional benefits of the project will be institutional linkages and enhancement.

Responsibilities:

In cooperation with the identified counterparts in Czechoslovakia, the Coordinator/Head Instructor will select institute participants, assign Canadian instructors to specific locations and ensure the effective start up of classes. She or he will instruct a section of master teachers in the Institute, with the additional responsibility for ensuring communication and general coordination.

Terms of Employment:

College or institute instructors will be seconded from their member institutions to the project. Specific conditions of secondment will be subject to agreement between ACCC and the member institution.

PROGRAMME CO-ORDINATOR - CANADA-CHINA COLLEGE LINKAGE PROGRAMME (CCCLP)

Roles and Responsibilities

The Co-ordinator will be posted in Beijing in the CCCLP office to work in close partnership with staff of the Chinese Educational Association for International Exchange (CEAIE), the Chinese counterpart on the programme.

Reporting to the Regional Director, Asia & Middle East Division or his designate, the co-ordinator will:

1. Ensure the smooth and effective functioning of the programme in administrative and financial systems, procedures, communications, infrastructure, etc.
2. Facilitate effective co-ordination of in-China and in-Canada administration and programme activities, keeping in focus the objectives of ACCC and the programme.
3. Act as liaison/resource person to CEAIE on subjects relating to ACCC, Canadian colleges and Canadian education system.
4. Participate in in-China activities such as orientation of Canadian cooperants, orientation of departing Chinese cooperants, workshops/seminars, CEAIE Advisory Committee meetings, problem solving, liaison with provincial education authorities, public relations with Canadian visitors where necessary.
5. Assist in planning, organization and implementation of Canadian inputs into national/regional outreach activities, especially in-China workshops and seminars.
6. Monitor programme funds and assist in the preparation of financial and progress reports.
7. Assist in the compiling, editing and/or translation of newsletters and other publications relating to the programme.
8. Assess the efficiency and effectiveness of programme/project implementation and make recommendations to the Regional Director.

Required Qualification and experience

- * Graduate from either a University or College with formal administrative training
- * Be knowledgeable with the Canadian community college/institute management system and has an understanding of the developmental assistance goals and objectives of the Government of Canada
- * Demonstrated experience in management and administration. Able to organize workload, work with minimum supervision, and function under often difficult working conditions. Able to sustain work pressure and attend to detail.
- * Good writing and verbal skills.
- * Fluency in English & Mandarin and literate in modern Chinese
- * Familiar with standard office equipment and communication devices. Able to type and use a microcomputer for word processing and spreadsheet applications.
- * Aware of the political/socio-economic milieu in China, and be able to act responsibly.
