GROLIER'S ELECTRONIC ENCYCLOPEDIA

- Q. Are there other services besides Electronic Mail available on SFU X-Change
- When you log onto SFU X-Change the list of available services appears on the screen. Those that are available to KEC Members besides Electronic mail are:
 - The Grolier On-line Encyclopedia
 - Accessing ERIC databases at UBC.
 - Computer Conferencing

Grolier On-line Encyclopedia

The Grolier On-line Encyclopedia is an updated version of the 20 volume *Academic American Encyclopedia* published in 1980. The encyclopedia databases are updated and revised four times per year.

This on-line encyclopedia is easy to use and does not take up valuable space on your book shelves..

Using the Grolier Encyclopedia:

When you sign on to SFU X-Change, you will be presented with a menu containing a number of choices. Choice number 3 is the Grolier Electronic On-line Encyclopedia.

When you have accessed this encyclopedia, you may search it for a particular word, eg *Ecology*. You may find that there are 89 articles on this topic, but you will then be given an opportunity to narrow the search by choosing one other word, eg *Arctic*..

You will now be searching for articles containing the words Ecology AND Arctic and will find that there are three such articles.

The information can be read onscreen, printed, or saved onto your hard disk or floppy disk and printed later at your convenience.

Scrolling through the information on screen:

To stop the information on the screen scrolling by more quickly than you can read it, press CTRL-O.

The screen may continue to scroll for a few seconds, but will soon stop.

A % sign will appear on the screen until you press ENTER to continue with the display.

To leave that article type ATTN at the % sign. After a few more rows, the display will stop.

More complete directions for using Grolier may be obtained from the Instructor's Computing Support Centre, or by calling me at Local 776.
