ABE ACTION PLAN

Since the last ABE ACTION PLAN UPDATE in February, many faculty and staff from the ABE Division and Student Service areas of the campus have been active on Task Force Subcommittees. A number of the sub-committees have completed their research and are drafting reports.



ABE Action Plan (Cont'd)

In all, eleven sub-committees have been established. Task Force #1: Instruction has six-subcommittees: Assessment, Physical Environment, Integration, Learning Styles, Technology and Curriculum Content. Task Force #2: External Access has two sub-committees: Student Profiles and New Students, and Advertising and Community Liaison. Task Force #3: Internal Access and Student Services has three sub-committees: Entry Procedures, Articulation and Transferability, and Retention.

At the June 19 Steering Committee/Sub-committee meeting, the group set time lines for completion of the ABE Action Plan. Sub-committee reports will go to Task Force Co-chairs by mid-October, Task Force reports will go to the Steering Committee by mid-November and the first draft of the Action Plan will be given to the Steering Committee by mid-December. The Steering Committee and Sub-committee Chairs will review the first draft and a revised draft Action Plan will be presented to the ABE Division at the end of January 1992.

As we head off on holidays and in some cases say good-bye to colleagues affected by the reduction sequence, I would like to extend a thank you to everyone connected with the ABE Action Plan. Your hard work and commitment to the process are very much appreciated.
