Computer Viruses:

The Continuing Problem

The problem of computer viruses is still very much with us at KEC. By way of illustration, here is something which happened just last week.

A very upset instructor came to me with a disk from which over half the files (more than 50) had suddenly vanished, and for which he had no backup copy. When I looked at the disk directory, the last filename in the list contained "garbage" characters, and was not one of his files. This is a typical symptom of the Stoned virus, and when I checked his disk with Virus Scan, that is what I found. Once the problem was identified, cleaning the virus off the disk with Clean Up is (usually) quite simple; however, that does not recover lost or damaged files. Fortunately I was able to use Norton Disk Doctor to recover the lost data, but that isn't always possible.

The Stoned virus (and its relatives and descendants), which was the villain of that story, is probably the most common computer virus problem at KEC. It is highly infectious, and since it doesn't necessarily cause any noticeable problems for a while, it has plenty of opportunity to spread. All it takes to infect a hard drive is to start the computer with an infected disk in drive A:. From then on, any floppy disk which is accessed (to retrieve files, store files, or run programs) by that computer will be infected too, and can go on to infect other computers.

Typical symptoms of infection by the Stoned virus are missing files, files that can no longer be loaded successfully, or contain scrambled data, strange file names appearing in the directory, and (occasionally) the words "Your computer is stoned." appearing on your screen.

What can you do about this problem? You should check your disks, and any computers you use, regularly with a virus detection program, and if necessary use a virus removal program to cure infections. I recommend using a virus protection program on any computer with a hard drive. You can get programs which do these things and instructions for their use from the ICSC. And you should always have a backup copy of important files.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ABESAP)

WHAT IS A.B.E.S.A.P.?

ABESAP is a program funded by the provincial government to provide partial grants for tuition fees only for needy students. With reduced funding this year, grants are limited and ABESAP will be funding no more than fifty percent of tuition fees.!!! Only one application is accepted per term.

(Spring term: January - April; Summer term: May - August; Fall term: Sept. - Dec.)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

You can apply for ABESAP if you are a Canadian citizen, landed immigrant or have refugee status. All students with S.I.N. starting with 900 must show immigration papers. ABESAP grants are available at V.C.C.-King Edward Campus for the following programs:

-V.O.V.I./V.O.H.I. - College Prep English 059
-B.E.S.T. - English Language Skills
-B.T.S.D. - English as a Second Language
-College Foundations (to grade 10) (Outreach, Canadiana,
-Pt-time Courses at Gr. 11/12 Vocational fee payer)
(CF, ABE, CPE & BTSD) - ESL - Institutional Aide

WHEN CAN I APPLY?

One month before registration, you can pick up an ABESAP application from the Financial Aid Office (#4029) or Counselling (#3002).

* RETURNING STUDENTS

If you are a <u>returning</u> student (have a K.E.C. student number), you must have the teacher's comment section B on your application completed. <u>Returning</u> students are advised to complete their applications as quickly as possible. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* NEW STUDENTS

If you are a <u>NEW</u> student (no K.E.C. student number), you can submit your application to the Financial Aid Office (#4029). You do <u>not</u> have to complete section B (teacher's comments) on your application form. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR ABESAP WILL BE DETERMINED ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS...IT IS RECOMMENDED TO APPLY EARLY (ONE MONTH BEFORE REGISTRATION!!!)

PLEASE NOTE:

- ALL **full-time** students who are being supported by MSSH must apply to MSSH for assistance and have MSSH provide a letter of refusal if they will not pay your tuition fees.
- 2) Continued ABESAP funding is dependent on successful academic progress.
 ABESAP MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS REPEATING THE SAME LEVEL AND RECEIPT OF ABESAP FUNDS IS DEPENDENT UPON ATTENDANCE.
