COUNTERFEIT \$100 BILLS

The Royal Bank of Canada has advised their Corporate clients that counterfeit one hundred dollars bills are appearing in various locations in Vancouver.

The following serial numbers have been identified as counterfeit:

AJL	9129917
AJL	9131408
AJM	0225435
AJM	2669634
AJD	6410597

To safeguard VCC - KEC against accepting these and other series that may follow please use the following guidelines:

1. Check all \$100.00 bills received for serial numbers. If the above serial numbers appear on the bill it is most likely counterfeit.
2. \$100.00 bills are brown in colour. The counterfeit bills are distinctively different - they have a strong yellow/brown overtone.
3. Every \$100.00 bill that is bonafide has a series of green spots (planchettes) appearing on the bill. These planchettes are referred to as watermarks and if tampered with by use of nail or a scraping device they can be removed. On counterfeit bills the green

spots cannot be removed since these bills are copies of originals.

4. If you or your designate believe that a \$100.00 bill is counterfeit, courteously tell that customer that you cannot accept the bill.
5. Your adherence to the above mentioned guidelines is appreciated. If you have any questions, give me a call at local 401.

FEE WAIVER TO EMPLOYEES

Vancouver Community College employees who are eligible to receive benefits are also eligible for tuition fee waivers on many Continuing Education courses. Fee waivers are not available for courses in the General Interest category where the fee includes supplies (such as Wine Appreciation), rentals (Learn to Paint Textiles), transportation (Travel Tours, Natural History) or internships/practicums.

Registration is limited to one fee waiver per computer course at the Oakridge Computer Lab. Please register early to avoid disappointment.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ABESAP)

WHAT IS A.B.E.S.A.P.?

ABESAP is a program funded by the provincial government to provide partial grants for tuition fees only for needy students. With reduced funding this year, grants are limited and ABESAP will be funding no more than fifty percent of tuition fees.!!! Only one application is accepted per term.

(Spring term: January - April; Summer term: May - August; Fall term: Sept. - Dec.)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

You can apply for ABESAP if you are a Canadian citizen, landed immigrant or have refugee status. All students with S.I.N. starting with 900 must show immigration papers. ABESAP grants are available at V.C.C.-King Edward Campus for the following programs:

WHEN CAN I APPLY?

One month before registration, you can pick up an ABESAP application from the Financial Aid Office (#4029) or Counselling (#3002).

*** RETURNING STUDENTS**

If you are a returning student (have a K.E.C. student number), you must have the teacher's comment section B on your application completed. Returning students are advised to complete their applications as quickly as possible. You can apply one month before you register !!!

*** NEW STUDENTS**

If you are a NEW student (no K.E.C. student number), you can submit your application to the Financial Aid Office (#4029). You do not have to complete section B (teacher's comments) on your application form. You can apply one month before you register !!!

*** DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR ABESAP WILL BE DETERMINED ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS...IT IS RECOMMENDED TO APPLY EARLY (ONE MONTH BEFORE REGISTRATION!!!)**

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1 ALL full-time students who are being supported by MSSH must apply to MSSH for assistance and have MSSH provide a letter of refusal if they will not pay your tuition fees.
- 2) Continued ABESAP funding is dependent on successful academic progress. ABESAP MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS REPEATING THE SAME LEVEL AND RECEIPT OF ABESAP FUNDS IS DEPENDENT UPON ATTENDANCE.
