POLICY:

General Principle

- A.1 The final date for registration for courses with fixed intake is designated as two weeks after the first day of class, in all Divisions.

Exception: Double Block Courses in the ABE Division

- A.2 a) Registration for Double Block Courses in College Foundations may take place up to one week after the start of class. For Single Block Courses the general principle prevails.
b) Transfer to other courses within the ABE Division will be permitted for one week beyond the final date for registration.

POLICY:

- A.1 Subsequent to the course change period, and up to and including the first instructional day of the last month of the course/program, students may withdraw from that course.
A.2 A "W" is placed on the transcript for each course from which a student withdraws. Calculation of grade point averages where applicable will exclude such courses.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 To withdraw, a student will complete a withdrawal form available from the Student Records office.
B.2 The student will receive his or her copy of the completed withdrawal form. Other copies will be distributed to admissions, counselling, and the Department Head and Instructor.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 In order to allow for FTE tabulation, as per the Ministry directive, the final date for registration will be determined as outlined above. Exceptions are at the discretion of the Division Chair or recommendation of the Department Head.

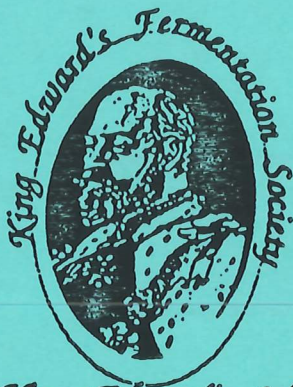

WHAT IS A.B.E.S.A.P.?

ABESAP is a program funded by the provincial government to provide **partial grants for tuition fees only** for needy students. With reduced funding this year grants are limited!!! **Only one application is accepted per term.** (Spring term: January-April; Summer term: May-August; Fall term: Sept.-Dec.)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

You can apply for ABESAP if you are a **Canadian citizen, landed immigrant or have refugee status.** All students with S.I.N. starting with 900 must show immigration papers. ABESAP grants are available at V.C.C.-King Edward Campus for the following programs:

- B.E.S.T.
- B.T.S.D
- College Foundations (to grade 10)
- Pt-time Courses at gr.11/12
- (CF, ABE, CPE & BTSD)

WHEN CAN I APPLY?

One month before registration, you can pick up an ABESAP application from the Financial Aid Office (#4029) or Counselling (#3002).

* RETURNING STUDENTS

If you are a returning student (have a K.E.C. student number), you must have the teacher's comment section B on your application completed. Returning students are advised to complete their applications as quickly as possible. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* NEW STUDENTS

If you are a NEW student (no K.E.C. student number), you can submit your application to the Financial Aid Office (#4029). You do not have to complete section B (teacher's comments) on your application form. You can apply one month before you register !!!

* DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR ABESAP WILL BE DETERMINED ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS...IT IS RECOMMENDED TO APPLY EARLY (ONE MONTH BEFORE REGISTRATION!!!)

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1) **ALL full-time** students who are being supported by MSSH must apply to MSSH for assistance and have MSSH provide a letter of refusal if they will not pay your tuition fees.
- 2) Continued ABESAP funding is dependent on successful academic progress. ABESAP MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS REPEATING THE SAME LEVEL AND RECEIPT OF ABESAP FUNDS IS DEPENDENT UPON ATTENDANCE.

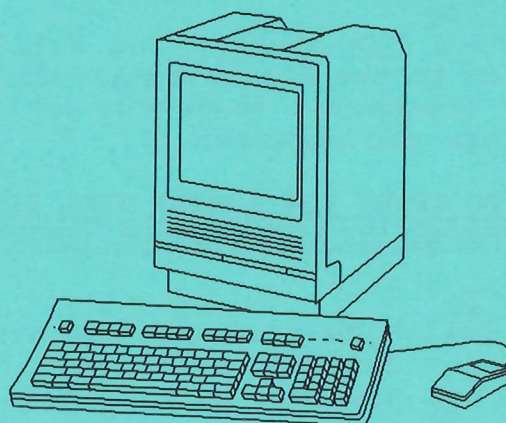

Explanation of Positions

1. Bargaining Committee Members
3 Elected "at large" plus one for each campus. Represent the VCC Membership and Union in Contract Negotiations with the College.
2. Stewards
VCC is currently under-represented in Stewards. Union Stewards represent co-workers in grievances and provide a Union presence at the work site. Union training is provided with a one day orientation (September 24th or 26th) and a Stewards' Weekend (November 7-11, 1991) in Nanaimo. Call, Joey Hartman at 873-7341 for more information.
3. Job Evaluation Committee
Members will meet, as required, to deal with appeals arising from the new Job Evaluation System. They will not deal with the overall system, but instead, will investigate specific applications. This Committee formation depends on Membership ratification of the Evaluation System on September 12th. Training will be provided.
4. Occupational Health and Safety Committee
Members on this Joint Committee meet with management reps on College time approximately once a month. The Committee looks at Health and Safety concerns that arise on the work site.
5. Fortnight Committee
Members assist in handling appeals from workers who are denied access to the fortnight schedule. Meet as required on College time.
6. Temporary Employees
This Committee will meet with the College to discuss ways of improving job security for temporary employees. Meetings will be held on College time.
7. College Board Observers
Members attend College Board Meetings as official observers of the Union.

**Technical Preparation for Women
Programme**

This is a part-time temporary position under the agency of the Electronics department at City Centre, and involves 150 hours of direct instruction in the following areas:

- a) 75 hours of refresher, high school mathematics with applications in electronics;
- b) 25 hours of introductory computer skills (MS-DOS and in introduction to Microsoft Works word processing); and
- c) 50 hours of very introductory electronics (includes component identification, terminology, schematic symbols and diagrams, the use of hand tools, and the supervision of two simple electronic construction projects.

The Technical Preparation for Women programme is a pre-entry programme, 348 hours in length which incorporates a life skills training component (198 hours), and academic upgrading component (150 hours as described above). Completers of the pre-entry programme will take an additional 1500 hours of electronics training.

It is expected that the academic upgrading portion of the programme will commence in October 1991 and run through December 1991 at three hours per day.
