ACTIVE LEARNING

with John Parker

The main result of introducing active learning into a classroom is that passive listeners soon become active learners. This workshop offers an alternative to lecturing, providing instructors with many practical ideas.

John Parker's workshops on active learning are in themselves active-learning workshops. During this one-day event, participants will be engaged in a series of workshops, applying each one to their own classroom needs. The workshops are practical so that participants leave with dozens of specific ideas that they can implement into their classes. Discussions of theory will be kept to a minimum.

Instructors will discover that in an active-learning classroom "the teacher does not teach, but simply provides an opportunity for students to learn" (Albert Einstein).

Since his retirement from the faculty of VCC, John Parker has given many workshops on active learning throughout North America and England. He has won teaching awards for his innovative approaches from the Association of Canadian Community Colleges and the University of Texas. John has authored six textbooks and currently Senior Consultant with McDougal Littell for their composition series.

For those who may be interested in purchasing instructional materials, John Parker's book, Workshop for Active Learning, will be available during the workshop at a reduced cost of \$15.00. The book includes over 200 workshop ideas. There will also be a computer disk available, which includes 75 handouts for students that instructors are able to modify for their own needs.
