## **"RETURNING HOME" PUBLICATION**

The Canadian Bureau for International Education has published a manual, "Returning Home" (November, 1991) as a guide to creating workshops for students, faculty, corporate personnel, diplomatic staff and their families who are returning to their country after an absence abroad. The difficulties of re-adjusting after re-entry to a home country are often unrecognized, and this manual gives leaders advice on how to attract participants to a re-entry workshop and to persuade them of its value, as well as setting out a step-by-step guide in the development and organization of the workshop itself.

"Returning Home" will be available in the International Education office after February 18.
