NOROOZ

The 20th day of March is the beginning of spring and marks the Iranian new year called "Norooz", which means New Day. Norooz is the first day of the Iranian calendar and has been celebrated for almost 3000 years by Iranians.

Weeks before Norooz, families prepare to celebrate the new year by placing seeds in bowls of water to ensure green shoots for the first day of spring. They clean their homes thoroughly, send new year's greeting cards to relatives and friends, and on the eve of the last Wednesday of the year everyone in the family jumps over a small bonfire, to leave behind the sorrows of the old year.

Hours before the beginning of spring, the family places seven objects called "HAFT SEEN" seven S's on a table. These are objects whose names begin with S and which represent happiness, vitality and health: Sabzeh - sprouted seeds; Sonebole - hyacinth; Seeb-Apples; Samanoo - Sweet wheat pudding; Serkeh - vinegar; Sumac; and Senjid - wild olive. It is also traditional to place a coloured egg on a mirror. As the new year begins the earth is said to tremble and so does the egg.

The hours preceding the beginning of spring are spent with family members. At the exact hour they wish each other health, happiness and good fortune for the new year and greet each other with hugs and kisses.

CILS

Students and instructors who are print impaired are eligible to use CILS (British Columbia College and Institute Library Services Clearinghouse for the Print Impaired). CILS is a lending, searching and production service that assists students and instructors to obtain textbooks and other information in alternate formats such as cassette tape, braille and computer diskette. In addition, CILS services are available to students who are learning disabled, as long as they have certification.

To register for CILS, students (and instructors) are required to have a CNIB number or a completed Disability Statement Form. Anyone wishing to register should come to the KEC

Library Information Desk to obtain forms and further information.

Pre-registering for CILS cuts down on the waiting period for texts, etc. and allows the Library time to identify a student's information needs before they become urgent. Any assistance instructors could provide by letting students know about CILS and the need to register early to access its services, would be greatly appreciated.
