# UBC LIBRARY CARDS FOR KEC FAULTY

As was announced recently, all term and regular instructors are eligible for free UBC library cards. Carol Mercier in the Principal's office will provide individuals with documentation to take to the Circulation office at the Main Library at UBC.

Upon UBC's receipt of your documentation in person, faculty will receive a card valid until the end of the academic year which is usually the end of August. You will have access to the 15 branch libraries at UBC and can renew by

telephone at all of them except Sedgewick Library. You may borrow most circulating items, but no periodicals, reserves, or media. No borrowing is allowed from the Wilson Recording Collection. The usual loan for most items is for two weeks. If an item is recalled and you have not returned it, you are responsible for the payment of fines. Neither VCC nor the KEC library will accept liability for any fines owed.

Although UBC has extensive library hours, they change periodically. It's advisable to call if you are unsure they will be open. If you need assistance with library research, it is best to visit UBC during the week. Reference assistance in the evenings and during the weekends is very limited. Convenient pay parking is available just east of the Main Library.






