REVISED COLLEGE ADMISSIONS POLICY

IN ACCORDANCE WITH NEW MINISTRY REGULATIONS, COLLEGE ADMISSIONS POLICY REGARDING CITIZENSHIP STATUS HAS BEEN REVISED.

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, APPLICATIONS WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED FROM PEOPLE WHO MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

POLICY NO: 2.1.2.3

- A.1 Adult Canadian citizens including permanent residents in Canada (landed immigrants) are eligible for enrolment at Vancouver Community College.
- A.2 By exception, those whose status in Canada falls within one or more of the following categories may be considered for enrolment as though they were Canadian citizens or permanent residents in Canada, including:
- a) a foreign domestic worker with a valid employment authorization permit.
- b) an individual who is in Canada to carry out official duties as a diplomatic or consular officer; or as a representative or official of a country other than Canada, or of the United Nations or any of its agencies, or of any intergovernmental organizations in which Canada participates; or as a dependent or a member of the staff of any such diplomat, consular officer, representative or official and is able to substantiate with an identity card issued by External Affairs which gives his/her position, date of issuance and date of validity.
- c) an individual who is in Canada, who has applied for Permanent Resident/Landed Immigrant Status and who can provide evidence of the "letter of approval in principle" to the institution for admission purposes.
- d) any person who has been determined under the Immigration Act to be a Convention Refugee and can present a letter from Employment and Immigration Canada confirming this.
- e) a person under an International exchange, scholarship or fellowship agreement where there has been joint approval by the receiving institution and by the Ministry of Advanced Education, Training and Technology.
- f) an individual with a valid full-time employment authorization permit and his/her dependents, excluding a person on a working holiday authorization or a refugee claimant who has yet to be determined a Convention Refugee, may be eligible for exemption on a special case application to the institution.
- g) a legal dependent of a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada providing that the dependent status is fully documented and has been established a minimum of one year prior to the student's application for exemption.

PROCEDURES

- B.1 All documents relating to proof of citizenship and/or status in Canada may be required at the time of application for enrolment in the College.
- B.2 If required, enrolment status will be determined by the respective campus Dean of Administrative and Student Services, or his/her delegate, when applications are being considered.
- B.3 Each campus shall keep a record of the individuals admitted under the exceptions provided for in A.2 and the item of College policy used as the basis for making the exception.

STUDENTS WHO DO NOT MEET THE ADMISSIONS CRITERIA AND WHO ARE CURRENTLY REGISTERED IN KEC PROGRAMS WILL BE ALLOWED TO CONTINUE IN THAT PROGRAM. STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO TRANSFER TO A NEW PROGRAM OR RE-REGISTER IF THEY STOP ATTENDING.
