CORRECTION NOTICE VOICEMAIL HINTS

Playing messages left in your voicemail box note the following hints are assuming you have pressed P to play the current message already:

- to give a message to another mailbox press G (4 key) to give, then enter the mailbox number to give the message to and record a short message to precede the message you are giving, press X (9 key) to send message. Then you must choose to keep or discard the original message.
- to rewind a message while playing it press * and it will move backward 5 seconds each time pressed
- to fast forward a message while playing it press # and it will move forward 5 seconds each time pressed

Changing your mailbox greeting - note assumed that you have already entered your mailbox (80*MB then your passcode):

- select U (8 key) for User options
- select G (4 key) for Greeting
- select R (7 key) to Record greeting
- verbally record the greeting and press X
 (9 key) to stop recording and save
- press L (5 key) to listen to your greeting
- press X (9 key) to exit from User options
- press X (9 key) to exit from your mailbox

JAY'S RECIPE FOR MANURE TEA

In last week's edition of the KEC Times we referred to something called "manure tea" in the want ad section. Because of the many inquiries and questions regarding the Classified ad, we are publishing the recipe for your use.

- 1. take several shovels full of <u>fresh</u> manure (preferably the bovine variety) and put in a large container (see want ads)
- 2. fill the container with water, stir, then allow to sit for a few days
- 3. using a bucket, scoop out the liquid (tea) and pour on your favourite shrubs but remember to refill the barrel with water and stir
