A Play from Romania

by Caryl Churchill

directed by Michael McLaughlin

Studio 58 is extremely proud to begin its 27th season with the **Canadian Premiere of MAD FOREST**, by world-renowned British playwright **Caryl Churchill**, on stage from October 1 to October 18.

How can we forget the bloody images of Nicolae and Elena Ceausescu after the December 1989 coup in Romania. From the confusion and turmoil of the events before, during and after the revolution, Caryl Churchill has shaped an urgent and electrifying play.

Just three months after the fall of Ceausescu, Churchill and 11 senior drama students from London's prestigious Central School travelled to Bucharest to begin their research. Based on conversations with Romanians, MAD FOREST recreates the events of the revolution as experienced by average citizens. This production focuses on young Romanians in their determination to look past the repression and thwarted hopes of a dictatorial regime toward positive change in a new society.

MAD FOREST will prove to be one of the most provocative and memorable shows of the season.

Caryl Churchill is the most widely performed and published dramatist in contemporary British theatre. Critics praise her work as witty and inventive and her plays are known for challenging social and dramatic conventions. She has more than 10 full-length plays to her credit, including Obie Award winners Cloud Nine (1979) and Serious Money (1987). Other plays include, Top Girls (1982), and Fen (1983).

After a five year absence from Vancouver and his alma mater Studio 58, Michael McLaughlin returns from his position as Artistic Director of Magnus Theatre in Thunder Bay, Ontario. Mr. McLaughlin has worked extensively on both coasts and his directorial credits include, Shirley Valentine, She Stoops To Conquer, Billy Bishop Goes To War, and Rock and Roll for Magnus Theatre; Woman In Mind, Angry Housewives, and Rattle In The Dash for the Arts Club Theatre.
