TEST ANXIETY WORKSHOP FOR KEC STUDENTS by THORNE HUSBAND, COUNSELLING DEPT.

October 23rd (Friday) 12:30-2:00 p.m. Room 3016 (Counselling Department)

This will be an informal mini lecture and discussion of test anxiety. Topics will include the general nature of test anxiety, effect of test anxiety on test performance, strategies and techniques for countering test anxiety, developing your own approach to coping with tests, and where to get additional professional help for test anxiety.

This workshop is for students who are well prepared for a test but who do poorly on a test because of test anxiety. The workshop would also be of benefit to persons who feel uptight while studying for a test. All interested students, however, are welcome to attend the workshop.

Handouts include: test anxiety symptom checklist, internal dialogue (categorization of thinking processes of high-test anxious students), instructions for relaxed breathing, and a guide to stress control.

BORROWING PRIVILEGES AT THE SFU LIBRARY

Just as at UBC, VCC faculty are eligible to apply for extramural cards at the W.A.C. Bennett Library at SFU. If you are interested, please see Carol Mercier in the principal's office first who will give you a letter of identification to present at the front desk of the SFU Library. There you will be given information about borrowing privileges and overdue fines which I have been warned are quite steep.

RESERVES IN THE KEC LIBRARY

If you wish to place items on reserve in the library for your students, please discuss this with one of our reference staff at the information desk or contact your subject librarian. In this way, we can place the item(s) on reserve for the period of time you wish and eventually return it to you or place it back on the regular circulating shelves.

We would appreciate your giving us the reserve materials at least a week before you announce their availability to your students. Library staff needs this lead time to create the reserve record and in many instances to package the materials appropriately.

If you are the new instructor in an established course for which there are many items on reserve, please let us know that you are now teaching the course. One of the best ways students can obtain reserve materials is to search our computer catalogue under the present instructor's name. We will be glad to change the instructor's name for the reserves once we hear from you.

B.C. Asia Pacific Awards

Your opportunity to work or study in Asia Pacific

If you want to expand your knowledge of an Asia Pacific culture and language, forge friendships and working relationships with people from another country, and share those experiences with fellow British Columbians on your return, you could qualify for the British Columbia Asia Pacific Awards.

The Ministry of Advanced Education, Training and Technology, through the British Columbia Centre for International Education, offers a variety of financial awards to public post-secondary students and professional staff eager to develop their understanding of the cultures, economics and languages of the Asia Pacific.

These awards are reserved for people who are keenly committed to cross-cultural understanding. Recipients represent Canada abroad and are expected to use the experience to promote understanding at home.

For professional staff, the British Columbia Asia Pacific Scholars' Awards provide financial support enabling recipients to work in Asia Pacific countries.

For students,

the British Columbia Asia Pacific Students' Awards are designed to offer financial support for award recipients attending rigorous programs of study in Asia Pacific countries.

Eligible applicants must be Canadian citizens or landed immigrants, and be permanent residents of British Columbia attending/working in a public post-secondary institution.


