BACHELOR OF EDUCATION DEGREE PROGRAM (ADULT EDUCATION ROUTE)

Vancouver Community College and the University of Alberta are pleased to announce that negotiations have been completed to link the British Columbia Provincial Instructor Diploma Program with a Bachelor of Education (BEd) degree in adult education.

This joint venture has come about as a result of an overwhelming demand from adult educators, the Society of Vocational Instructors post-secondary institutions and others in the province who wanted to see a career ladder in place for instructors in adult education institutions and programs.

There are some real advantages for instructors living in British Columbia in the University of Alberta degree.

- First, instructors receive one year of advanced standing for their training and experience.
- They receive credit for all of the courses in the Provincial Instructor Diploma and the Vancouver Community College or Diploma in Adult Education.
- They may take the non-education university transfer courses at any recognized community college or university and have them transferred for credit in the U of A degree.
- They can take all of the courses in the degree in British Columbia.
- The courses will be offered around the province on a basis similar to the Provincial Instructor Diploma Program. (weekends, evenings)

Courses in the degree will be offered at various locations around the province. During the first year of the program, the University of Alberta courses (Component 3) will be offered in Vancouver and the Provincial Instructor Diploma and Diploma in Adult Education courses (Component) will be offered in several locations based on interest in the program. Timetables for theses courses are available from the Program Development and Staff Training Department, Vancouver Community College.

The Marriage of Bette and Boo a hilarious off-the-wall comedy

STUDIO 58 announces a brilliant and funny dissection of marriage and the family in contemporary America, by master satirist Christopher Durang. The play is both devastatingly perceptive and wildly comic.

Bette and Boo are united in matrimony, surrounded by their beaming families. However, as time passes it becomes increasingly clear that things are not working out as hoped. The birth of their son is followed by a succession of stillborns, Boo takes to drink, and their odd families only add to the disharmony.

As usual, Durang takes a potentially tragic situation and discovers in it both humanity and wild humon.

CHRISTOPHER DURANG (Playwright), a graduate of the Yale School of Drama, has been writing for the theatre since 1971. His success as a playwright has been attributed to his sharp satiric sense and his ability to "wrap life's horrors in the primary colors of absurdist comedy". Besides THE MARRIAGE OF BETTE AND BOO, Durang's other successful comedies include BEYOND THERAPY, THE ACTOR'S NIGHTMARE and SISTER MARY IGNATIUS EXPLAINS IT ALL FOR YOU.

PAMELA HAWTHORN (Director) has been Manager, Creative Affairs, Western Office of Telefilm, since July, 1989. Prior to her Telefilm appointment Pamela was Artistic and Managing Director of the NEW PLAY CENTRE for 18 years. Educated at the Yale School of Drama, Ms. Hawthorn has directed numerous productions including NED AND JACK, THE UNVEILING and UNDER THE SKIN (New Play Centre), JACK SPRATT (Vancouver Playhouse), PRIVATE LIVES, OTHELLO (Globe Theatre, Regina), STARGAZING, TAMING OF THE SHREW (Stratford Festival) and for Studio 58, AHI WILDERNESS, THE ARISTOCRATS and LOVE'S NEAR MISS.






