### PROCESS FOR IDENTIFYING QUALITIES AND COMPETENCIES OF A PRINCIPAL FOR KING EDWARD CAMPUS

At the last meeting of the KEC Council, a recommendation was made that the process for recruitment of a Principal for KEC commence January 1993. A Task Force was to be developed to implement the process for gathering input, from the Campus community, on the qualities and competencies required of a principal for King Edward Campus. This Task Force has now been formed and consists of Betty Nobel, Marta Gardiner, Karen Kelly, Manuel Salinas and Sam Lewindon as the Chair. The process identified by the Task Force is designed to provide broad based input from the Campus community.

A tentative schedule for the input process is as follows:

- The task force will develop a survey instrument by Tuesday, November 24.
- Immediate distribution of the survey will be through the regular departmental mail network and through the King Edward Students Association.
- Collection of data will be through collection boxes located at KEC North, KEC Rm. 3141, the King Edward Campus Library, KEC Administration Office 4th Floor and the King Edward Students Association Office.
- Return of surveys by December 3.
- Data compiled by December 8.
- Survey results distributed December 8/9.
- Input forums December 10, 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m and 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

(locations to be announced).

• Final report available the week of December 14.

The KEC Council also recommended a revision of policy no. 4114 the "Selection of Administrators". The revision would include in the selection committee, a faculty member at large, a member of the VMREU and a student representative.


