





REPORT OF THE TASK FORCE ON QUALITIES AND COMPETENCIES OF A PRINCIPAL FOR KEC.

The Task Force met on Friday December 18th to review the findings of the survey and to prepare the following report. This report reflects the top ten qualities, ranked by percentage of the respondents using the "A" category. The response rate was less than anticipated due in part to the labour dispute and the change in scheduled return date. Eighty replies were received for tabulation. Several late replies were received and the written comments of these were added to the result.

THE PROFILE

In order of importance, the following are the "Top Ten" response categories.

1.	Committment to Quality Instruction	95%
2.	Solves Problems Effectively	79%
3.	Listens Actively and Willingly	77%
4.	Is Fair and Has High Moral and Ethical Standards Regarding the Treatment of Students, Staff and Faculty	77%
5.	Advocates Strongly for Students, Staff and Faculty	76%
6.	Advocates Strongly for KEC	74%
7.	Committment to and Working Knowledge of Developmental Programs	73%
8.	Has Proven Ability as a Leader	68%
9.	Synthesizes Ideas and Initiates Appropriate Action	67%
10	Works in a Consultative Style of Decision Making with Students, Faculty and Staff	65%

1. "Spreadsheet-Ready" - on floppy disk. (You will get this form unless you specify otherwise.)

Data in quotes with comma separators. Can be imported directly into a spreadsheet.

2. "Names-Only" - on floppy disk.

Comma between family and given names. Useful for loading into a wordprocessing program.

3. "BlueBook-Ready" - on floppy disk and/or on printed sheet.
