B.C. ASIA-PACIFIC AWARDS: Asia Pacific Grant Program

The Asia-Pacific Grant Program has been developed in addition to funding provided through the BC Asia-Pacific Awards for Scholars and Students.

The British Columbia Centre for International Education has received an allocation from the Ministry of Advanced Education, Training and Technology to fund the Asia-Pacific Grant program. The program has been established to enhance British Columbia public post-secondary students' understanding of the Asia-Pacific region and to contribute to the strengthening of linkage and exchange agreements between British Columbia and overseas institutions. The Asia-Pacific Grant program will provide small grants to enable student participation in an organized, related program of study at an overseas institution.

A budget will be set annually by the Ministry of Advanced Education, Training and Technology for the Asia Pacific Grant program. The program will be administered through the British Columbia Centre for International Education and the awards will be adjudicated by a committee representing the British Columbia post-secondary system.

The deadline dates for submission are November 1 and February 1.
