The aim of this process is to energize the educational systems of the province to assist in providing Canada with a skilled workforce to compete successfully in global competition.

John Cruickshank had announced at the Nanaimo Conference that VCC would host the next in hopefully a series of ongoing events. With the VCC event in mind, a group of participants at "Nanaimo" started to brainstorm on the kind of event VCC should stage. In order to tap into the full talent of VCC, additional input is required to develop a planning group for this 1994 event.

To date, lead up activities to a possible October 1994 Summit on Applied Studies could include

such events as: The KEC Automotive and Diesel Trade Show and "Symposium on Training Linkages" planned for October 21 and 22, 1993, and the proposed Open House Event planned for City Centre in March 1994.



Free Computers

Can your department use an old XT Computer? Computers in the two networked labs in the Business & Computer Studies Department will soon be replaced with new 486 systems.

A subcommittee of the Computer Needs Committee has been appointed to adjudicate requests for new KEC homes for the 49 old computers and 2 printers.



The XT computers are NOT capable of running Microsoft Windows or Windows applications. Only two have hard disks and can run WordPerfect; the other 47 computers have only floppy drives, and cannot run WordPerfect, Excel, dBase, Lotus 1-2-3, or other industry-standard software. Prospective recipients should also be warned that the used computers are, indeed, very much used. The price is right, though, because they are free to a good home.
