ALLOCATION FOR 93/94

ALLOCATION PER FTE INSTRUCTOR: \$ 240.00

The reduction from the 92/93 allocation of \$300.00 is due to two reasons: First, there is a significant increase in the number of instructors who qualify for funds this year. KEC has 267 FTE and CC 185 FTE.

Second, more instructors are using their funds and we can no longer assume to have a surplus at year-end. Should a surplus occur, the collective agreement allows for a 20% carry-over to subsequent years.

POOLING

You wouldn't think we would have trouble giving money away. We do. Some people still don't use their funds nor do they make them available to a needy colleague. We urge all parties to be more assertive in the offering (and soliciting) of unused funds. For example, you may wish to make arrangements for reciprocal pooling over a period of several years so that all members of a pooling group have a chance to attend an expensive conference. Instructors may wish to nudge tardy spenders at departmental meetings and help organize local pooling arrangements.

All requests are subject to approval by the PD Funds Committee.

PD FUNDS ETIQUETTE

- 1. **DON'T WAIT** until February, 1994 to apply.
- 2. Please respect **DEADLINES**. These are not pulled out of a hat, but are necessary for the committee to do its work and satisfy VCC Accounting procedures. You risk losing your allocation, even if you have already spent money, if you do not submit required documentation on time.

- 3. READ THE PD FUNDS BULLETINS and the PD FUNDS GUIDELINES in the COLLECTIVE AGREEMENT. Failure to follow simple rules delays your application and really \%@#>!*~s us off!
- 4. USE the PD FUNDS MAILBOX at your campus for all correspondence with the committee. Putting it in the mailbox of a committee member may seriously delay your application. An individual may be absent or no longer on the committee.
- 5. DO NOT ASSUME we have received your application if you have turned it over to a **DEPARTMENT HEAD** or **DIVISION CHAIR**. Please track it. The committee usually meets every 2-3 weeks, so if you've heard nothing for some time, you may wish to check its progress.
- 6. To the vast majority of you, THANK YOU for submitting on time and in order. We were heartened to see people spending their money in unique and creative ways.


