New videos

Those with an interest in gerontology and life in our later cycles will enjoy **Age is No Barrier** (1989, 24 min.) This is a genuine and inspiring profile of the U of Agers, an Edmonton based seniors gymnastics team which thrives on laughter and friendship. **Second Debut** (1991, 8, min.) is a lighthearted animated short of how Sophie comes to terms with providing challenge, self-worth and pleasure for herself upon retirement. A more scientific examination of the mechanisms at work during the aging process and advances in longevity studies feature in **How To Die Young, As Late as Possible?** (1985, 30 min.).

We have acquired an older, but truly unique series documenting Japanese history and evolution. **Japan, The Changing Tradition** (1978, 5 X 30 min.). The series examines from the first contacts with Western culture in the 16th century to the emergence of leading world economic power in the 1970's. This video is rich in never-released archival footage.

Middle English fans will love **Chaucer Reads Chaucer: The Miller's Tale** (1988, 58 min.) Professor Joe Gallagher, as Chaucer, reads in the original dialect with Modern English subtitles added. All are dressed in period costume.

Those carnations you purchased at the florist's may come with a dubious history. **Love, Women and Flowers** (1988, 55 min.) documents Colombia's floriculture industry and the oppressive and dangerous conditions for workers found therein.

Oka and the Mercier Bridge became indicative of the friction between white and aboriginal cultures in Canada today. **Acts of Defiance** (1992, 105 min.) offers a thorough examination of these events.

Remember Africville (1991, 35 min) chronicles a black Halifax community whose residents were uprooted and their homes destroyed in the 1960's. The film questions an urban planning policy that forces people from their homes on racial grounds.

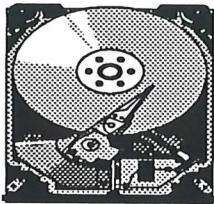

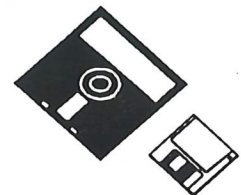
