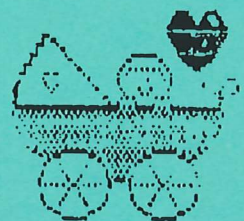

**Temporary Teaching position, St. John's College, Ladprao, Bangkok, Thailand.**
