BC College and Institute Library Services for the Print Impaired (CILS)

CILS Services

Materials lending, searching, and production services are provided free to persons with print disabilities in BC colleges and institutes. All students and instructors with visual, learning, and physical disabilities which preclude the use of conventional print, are eligible for CILS services. Clients must meet CILS verification requirements.

Taped, brailled and large-print books are provided. CILS staff searches titles and subjects requested by the college and institute Interlibrary Loan staff on behalf of their clients. The search covers resources in the CILS collection as well as from other local, provincial, national, and international agencies. If appropriate materials cannot be located, CILS will produce new taped books after receiving permission from copyright holders.

Reminders for Counsellors

The fall term is almost upon us. What better time to remind counsellors who will be registering students with print disabilities* that CILS services can be facilitated in the following ways.

1. As soon as the student has made a commitment to registering, send CILS a completed Recording for the Blind "Application for Service" form. (If you don't have your own copy, you may either ask your Interlibrary Loan (ILL) person or you may call CILS.) Ignore the \$25 application fee — CILS pays it. But, it is important to send CILS this form as early as possible as registration takes 6-8 weeks. Not only does it provide CILS with documentation of the student's disability, it permits the student access to the largest collection of taped textbooks in North America.

2. Send CILS the student's textbook (via your ILL department) as early as possible. It is essential that CILS has the edition and date of publication in addition to full author/title/publisher information. ISBNs are also invaluable for sorting one "Introduction to Sociology" from another. Although the deadline for CILS September production was in mid-July, it may still be possible to produce taped books for mid-October. Or, CILS could send you a list of alternate titles. (If the instructor has concerns about finding a print copy of an

older edition or an alternate title, your ILL department should be able help you.)

3. Make sure the student has access to a four track cassette player. Although CILS and several other producers provide texts on standard 2 track, 1 7/8 ips cassettes, Recording for the Blind, CNIB, and others produce on 4 track, 15/16 ips tapes. While all four track playback units can handle either format, the reverse is not true. CILS

has a limited number of 4 track players for loan, with preference being given to learning disabled students. Legally blind users are usually equipped through CNIB. CILS also has purchasing information if your student or department wishes to own one.

4. If you have any questions or concerns, please call. Sometimes a little discussion or clarification of the student's requirements can help smooth the way!

* Persons who are legally blind, have a physical disability such that a book can not be held or the pages turned, or have a learning disability.

EMERGENCY FIRST AID PROCEDURES

- A. Ensure the accident scene is safe - no further danger to injured worker or self.
- B. Do not move patient unless there is a high risk of further injury. Keep calm and do not leave patient unattended.
- C. Call 4444 on an internal phone. Give exact location and nature of emergency. A First Aid Attendant will respond.
- D. Stay with victim until the First Aid Attendant arrives. Follow the attendant's instructions after he/she arrives.
