





Studio 58's 28th season continues with LOST SOULS AND MISSING PERSONS by award-winning Canadian playwright Sally Clark. Directed by Robert Metcalfe this bizarre comedy opens on Saturday, November 20 and plays for 17 performances only.

LOST SOULS AND MISSING PERSONS is the story of Hannah, a nondescript woman in her forties, who, while on holiday with her husband in New York City, suddenly realizes she doesn't know who or where she is. This unpredictable comedy follows Hannah's encounters with a strange string of characters as she seeks her true identity. Full of black, biting humour LOST SOULS AND MISSING PERSONS is an imaginative and challenging work in its scope and style. A production not to be missed!

LOST SOULS AND MISSING PERSONS is Sally Clark's first play. Clark has received impressive accolades for her plays including a Chalmers Award and a Dora Award for Moo. Other plays include The Trial of Judith K. (which was short-listed for both a Chalmers and a Governor General's Award) Ten Ways to Abuse an Old Woman (which was adapted into a short film produced by the Canadian Film Centre in 1993), Jehanne of the Witches and Life Without Instruction. Her newest work, Saint Frances of Hollywood, a play about Frances Farmer, will be produced by the New Play Centre, Alberta Theatre Projects and the Belfry Theatre in 1994.

MORE...

Since graduating from Studio 58 in 1979, Robert Metcalfe has worked as an actor, director and fight choreographer for every major theatre company in Western Canada. A Vancouver resident, Metcalfe's recent work includes: directing the highly acclaimed Medea's Disgust by John Lazarus; working as an assistant director to John Cooper for Love and Anger and My Children, My Africa at the Vancouver Playhouse; and directing Arena Theatre's production of Relatively Speaking. He is also the Associate Director for Green Thumb Theatre. LOST SOULS AND MISSING PERSONS represents his directorial debut for Studio 58.

Ken MacDonald joins the production team as set and poster designer for LOST SOULS AND MISSING PERSONS. His distinctive work has garnered many awards including a 1993 Jessie Award for his work last season and a Dora Award for 7 Stories, written by Morris Panych. Most recently he designed Life Science for Green Thumb Theatre. Later this season he will design the set and costumes for Anatol for the Belfry in Victoria; White Biting Dog for Tarragon Theatre in Toronto and The Struggle of the Dogs and The Black for the Vancouver Playhouse.

Kate King is one of Vancouver's busiest designers. Her most recent credits include: costumes for Cat On a Hot Tin Roof, the Arts Club Theatre; set and costumes for Criminals in Love, Green Thumb Theatre; set and costumes for Dancing At Lughnasa, Sunshine Theatre; costumes for The Kat Who Would Be Kool, Studio 58 and costumes for Springrites! 93, the New Play Centre. Her upcoming projects include designing costumes for The Tempest at the New Bastion Theatre in Victoria.

This is Adrian Muir's third show for Studio 58 having previously designed lighting for Mad Forest and Scenes From A Courtroom. His most recent design credits include The Miracle Worker for Richmond Gateway Theatre, Much Ado About Nothing for the Vancouver Playhouse and Dancing At Lughnasa for Sunshine Theatre. Before returning to the West, Mr. Muir spent much of the last decade in Toronto collaborating with a host of independent dance and theatre companies. Muir also worked as assistant lighting designer for the national touring production of Phantom of the Opera.




