### **New Videos**

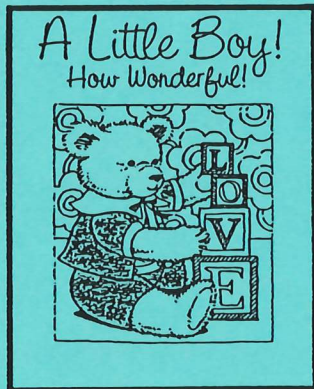

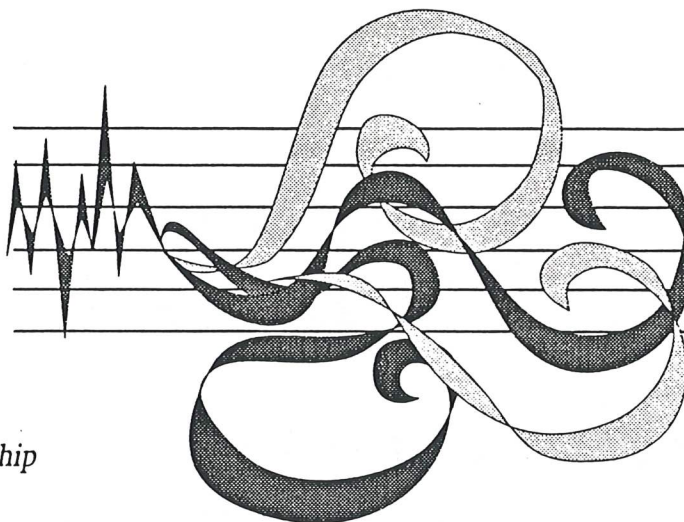

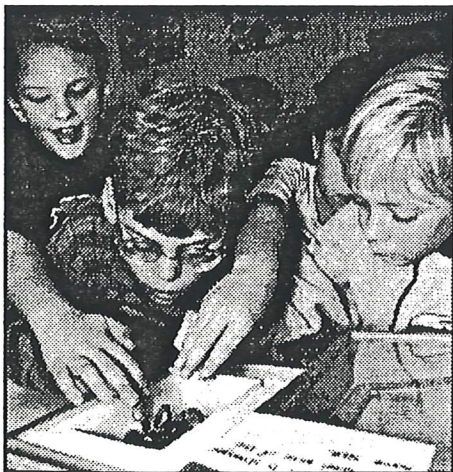
