"What are the implications of the Freedom of Information and Privacy Act?"

Speaker: Sadie Kuehn is the Managing Editor and Curriculum Project Developer for Legal Services and the Vice President of Freedom of Information and Privacy Association. She produces the "Legal Perspective" five times a year for students and teachers in B.C.

The Freedom of Information and Privacy Act was proclaimed approximately one year ago. Challenging questions are raised for counsellors and educators around record keeping in students' files. There are a number of other implications - what can be considered public information and what the public has a right to see versus right of individual privacy? One of the major areas under discussion is the effect for school counsellors and teachers - what kind of data should be kept in students' files? She will discuss other issues, such as, how much right does the government have to collect information on people?
