Please advise your <u>students</u> that drop-in counselling <u>is still available</u> on Fridays, even though the reception area is closed.


- Telephone numbers 443-8443 and 443-8453 in Counselling will be not answered on Fridays but counsellors and staff will answer their direct lines.

ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

With interest in teaching on the rise, many faculty are eager to examine, discuss, and reflect upon their teaching practice--and how to improve it. Strategies for doing so include the development and discussion of case studies about pedagogical issues; attention to teacher narratives and stores; the use of cases and narratives in the classroom with students; and the practice of classroom research and assessment techniques for understanding more about student learning. Such strategies for reflective practice will be the focus of a conference July 20-23, 1994, in Vancouver, B. C., at the University of British Columbia Conference Center.

This will be an intense, action-packed, fun-filled, three-and-a-half day, "working conference," limited to 100 participants, led by people who have organized national conferences and workshops, directed national projects, and written extensively on issues of reflective practice.

CONFERENCE AIMS AND OUTCOMES

The purpose of this conference is help you learn to use strategies for self-reflection and teaching improvement on your campus with your colleagues and in your classroom. Specifically you will have an opportunity to:

- --prepare and lead a case discussion
- --write a case study of your own
- --develop and explore your own teaching stories
- --learn techniques to use student narratives
- --practice classroom research and assessment techniques
- --work with conference colleagues to develop a framework for reflective teaching practice

CONFERENCE FACULTY INCLUDE:

PATRICIA CROSS, Elizabeth and Edward Conner Professor of Higher Education at the University of California, Berkeley, whose concept of classroom research and assessment has helped thousands of faculty investigate and improve their students' learning.

THOMAS ANGELO, founding director of the Academic Development Center at Boston College and co-author, with Pat Cross, of *Classroom Assessment Techniques* and other books and articles.

DIANE GILLESPIE, Professor of Educational Psychology at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, who has worked with and written about the power of teachers' stories as a strategy for self-reflection and insightful discussion.

MARY KAY KRAMP, Consultant for Performance Assessment for the College of Education and LEE HUMPHREYS, Director of the Learning Research Center and Professor of Religious Studies, both at the University of Tennessee, who co-direct a FIPSE project on student narratives and self-assessment.

BARBARA LEIGH SMITH and a team of faculty from the Washington Center for Improving the Quality of Undergraduate Education, whose work over the last few years (on cases and on student self-assessment, for example) has been aimed at promoting reflective practice.

PAT HUTCHINGS, Director of the Teaching Initiative at the American Association for Higher Education, whose work (including a volume on cases as a tool for reflective teaching practice) focuses on ways to create a campus "culture" in which the improvement of teaching is continually pursued.

BILL WELTY, Professor of Management and RITA SILVERMAN, Professor of Teacher Education, both at Pace University, authors of case books in teacher education and faculty development and co-directors of two FIPSE projects to develop case studies and to help college faculty understand how to use them.

SCHEDULE AND LOCATION

The conference will begin at 3 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20, and end after lunch on Saturday, July 23. There will be a welcome reception and dinner on Wednesday and free evenings on Thursday and Friday to enjoy the lovely and exciting Vancouver area.

The conference will be held on the campus of the University of British Columbia. Lodging will be available in University housing in the Walter Gage Complex at rates beginning at \$24 a night, but those who prefer may reserve space at hotels near the campus.

FEES

The conference fee which includes an extensive set of conference materials (including prepublication materials), opening reception and dinner, lunches on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, and refreshment breaks is \$400. Because of the power of faculty working together on projects like this, you are strongly urged to consider attending as part of a campus team. Discounts of \$50 per registration are available for members attending as part of a campus team and for AAHE members.
