### IN MEMORIUM...

Employees and students at Vancouver Community College were shocked and saddened to hear of the death of ESL Instructor Barbara Gray-Richards in a helicopter accident in Hawaii.

Ms. Gray-Richards joined the College in 1972 and twice served as Department Head for the College Preparatory English Department, although she never severed her ties with the classroom.

She served on numerous professional committees including the editorial boards to TESL (Teaching English as a Second Language) and TEAL (Teaching of English as an Additional Language).

Barbara was recognized for her excellence in teacher training and was responsible for developing the Teaching English for Academic Purposes course in VCC's TESL Certificate Program. She taught this course from 1987 to 1994 at both VCC and Malaspina College.

Two of her published texts: <u>Composition - Writing Academic English for Students of English as a Second Language</u>, and <u>Teaching English for Academic Purposes</u>, are widely used throughout the province.

Barbara placed great importance on Canadian studies in the education of second language learners and developed a rich Canadian Studies curriculum. This, along with her commitment to excellence, put a unique stamp on her department, which offers one of the largest academic English programs for ESL students in North America.



# THE INTER-NATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF RACISM



Facilitated by Alchemy Theatre Lab Funded by Multiculturism B.C.

On March 21, 1994, the United Nations' International Day for the Elimination of Racism. students at King Edward Campus witnessed scenes of racism, and had the opportunity to try to put a stop to it. Those who attended this event watched a student-generated scene depicting situations where racism occurs at College. After viewing the scene once, members of the audience were able to interrupt the action and try their hand at effectively stopping racist oppression. Both the audience and the actors themselves were able to assess the impact of different interventions, gaining a clearer understanding of the forms racism takes and how to effectively speak out against it.

The interactive theatre workshop was the end result of 15 hours of training, during which nine KEC students worked under the guidance of Patty Fraser and Victor Porter of Alchemy Theatre. This event, and the training of the students who developed the play, took place due to a cooperative effort between the Harassment Issues Advisor at VCC, Shirin Theophilus, and Starlet Lum and Gosia Kawecki of MOSAIC, Vancouver. The professional actors introduced the students to theatre exercises for the purpose exploring individual experiences discrimination and racism at the College. The short scene emerged from a collective examination of these experiences.

One of the purposes of bringing such an opportunity to the College was to begin to break the silence of racist oppression. One of the student actors, Josi Zedel, found that this experience has allowed her to become "much

more aware" of the sometimes subtle forms racism takes at school. "Now I am really digging inside, and I am more aware of body gestures - I can read people better". By openly acknowledging that racism exist, members of the College community may become better prepared to take action against it, with the faith that positive change may take place. Another of the actors involved, Mel Baconfield, clearly made the point that change is feasible: "Working in this program for only four days, I realized that even little things I did were discriminatory, but I am more aware now". This experience has also had an impact on Mel's life outside of the College, as he recently found himself speaking out against discrimination while riding the bus: "I never would have done that before, but because of the play, I realized that even one person can make a difference".

The student group is hoping to continue their work together, and to bring their piece of antiracist forum theatre to audiences at other campuses. Enquiries may be made through Shirin Theophilus, Harassment Issues Advisor, VCC 871-7040 (voice mail).

This is a challenge for the First Annual B.C. College and Institute Bursary Cyclathon.

It is the intent for each institution to sponsor a team which would be representative of faculty, students, administration? and board? For the initial cyclathon, UCC already has a team in place which is comprised of faculty and one Board member. They are busy gathering their pledges.
