New Videos in the Library

Although the term "humorous management video" may seem like an oxymoron, John Cleese's Meeting, Bloody Meetings (1993, 35 min.) is both hilarious and effective. This is a brand-new and completely revised version of the 1976 classic.

OKanada (1991, 33 min.) is yet another visual account of the 1990 Oka siege. The last 17 days of the crisis were taped by a journalist who snuck through the lines of the barricaded Mohawk encampment.

Living With Stress (1991, 46 min.) comes from "The Nature of Things" series and profiles the social and lifestyle factors that contribute to this insidious phenomenon.

Applauded by some and censured by others, The Valour and the Horror (1992, 3 x 105 min.) offers a critical and controversial look at Canada's role in WW II.

Watch your favourite Canadian politicians from the 80's and early 90's in action in the **Understanding Parliament** series (1991, 6 x 25 min.). This series, intended for upper-level audiences, describes the electoral process, examines the workings of Parliament and follows the process of passage of a bill.

Also available for your approval are the complete videotaped proceedings of Crossing the Bridges: Women's Issues Conference (1993, 5 tapes, 250 min. total). This conference was held at KEC on September 25, 1993 and featured Sunera Thobani as keynote speaker.
