Successful applicants will have the opportunity to review existing health and social development programs and participate in developing strategies that focus on meeting community needs and provide for integrated program delivery. A Master's Degree, MED or MSW, with extensive experience providing education and training to First Nations individuals and/or communities is expected and preferred.

We hope to provide four (4) courses each year for three (3) years

beginning January, 1995.

\$40,000 - \$50,000 per year contract plus all directly related expenses.

Kim Selody, Director - Artistic Director of the New Play Centre since November 1991, Kim has worked as a director, writer and actor across Canada, the U.S., England and the Netherlands. Kim's recent directing credits include: David King's Contents Under Pressure for the 1994 New Play Festival; Nicola Cavendish's Blowin' on Bowen for the Arts Club Theatre; and The New Play Centre production of Voices of Christmas. Other directing credits include: The Exercise D'Ensemble for the National Theatre School of Canada; and Verdacht, Un Mordspel for Theatre Lawine in Rotterdam. His writing credits include: The Diplomat, Suddenly Shakespeare, Synthetic Energy and Fool's Angel. Kim has worked extensively in Theatre for Young Audiences with Axis Mime Theatre, Carousel Theatre, Green Thumb Theatre, Manitoba Theatre for Young People and the Caravan Theatre Company. The Two "Gentlemen" of Verona is Kim's fourth production for Studio 58, having previously directed John Lazarus' Village of Idiots, A Slap in the Farce by Eugene Labiche and Cloud Nine by Caryl Churchill.

Shari Ulrich, Composer - An accomplished musician, talented songwriter and seasoned entertainer, Shari began her career in music in the 1970's recording and performing with the popular and eccentric trio The Pied Pumkin String Ensemble and Valdy's Hometown Band. After striking out on her own and recording two critically acclaimed albums she was awarded a Juno for Most Promising Female Artist in 1981. Since then, among other accomplishments, Shari has released three additional albums, composed extensively for television and along with Bill Henderson and Roy Forbes formed the group UHF. She is nominated for a Genie Award for the song "Every Road" from the film Max. The Two "Gentlemen" of Verona marks her theatrical debut.

Helen Jarvis, Set Designer - Helen designs for theatre, film and television and has worked on a wide variety of projects over the years. She is currently the Art Director for Robin's Hoods, a 22 part television series produced by Spelling Television. Helen was also the Art Director for Ernest Goes to School and Ernest Rides Again, both filmed in Vancouver last summer. She will next design the set for the Vancouver Playhouse production of The Cherry Orchard. The Two "Gentlemen" of Verona marks Helen's return to Studio 58 after a lengthy absence. Previous Studio 58 credits include designing set and costumes for Fanshen, The Slab Boys and costumes for Engaged.

Mara Gottler, Costume Designer - Mara's recent design credits include the Bard on the Beach productions of King Lear, directed by Alan Scarfe and The Merry Wives of Windsor, directed by Douglas Campbell. She is currently designing the upcoming 1995 Bard season productions of Hamlet and Comedy of Errors. Mara has designed for such diverse companies as: The Saidye Bronfman Theatre Centre, Montreal; The Ryerson Theatre, Toronto; the Vancouver Opera Association; the Judith Marcuse Dance Company; and the Frederic Wood Theatre. Mara designed the costumes for Studio 58's production of She Loves Me last Spring.

Del Surjik, Lighting Designer - Del works as a designer, actor and director across Canada. He codesigned the internationally acclaimed 1989 bilingual production of Romeo and/et Juliette directed by Robert Lepage and Gordon McCall for Shakespeare on the Saskatchewan. Since settling in Vancouver he has received four Jessie Award nominations for his lighting designs. As a design team member he was awarded a Jessie for the 1993 Robert Lepage production of Polygraph. His latest Vancouver work includes lighting designs for the Grinning Dragon Theatre production of The Compleat Works of Love and the Pink Ink Theatre production of The Fall of the House of Usher. He can next be seen performing Silvius in As You Like It for the Sudbury Theatre Centre. The Two "Gentlemen" of Verona is Del's first show for Studio 58.






