IN CASE YOU'RE WONDERING....

ACADEMIC AND INSTRUCTIONAL COUNCIL, JOINT COUNCIL, VCC COUNCIL, VCC BOARD AND BOARD COMMITTEES WHO DOES WHAT AND HOW DOES IT ALL WORK?

You will be familiar with the imminent proclamation of Bill 22 and the implications of the Bill. You will know that the Bill provides for the inclusion of four elected internal Board members (a VCCFA elected representative, a VMREU elected representative and two elected student representatives). You will also be aware of the introduction of an Education Council into the governance structure of all community colleges and institutes in BC. The Education Council has an advisory role to the Board. It will also make by laws for the conduct of the business of the Education Council. Decisions in certain areas will require the joint approval of the Education Council and the College Board.

Details of the process have yet to be finalized, but if you would like a copy of Bill 22, which will be proclaimed on January 01, 1995, please call Sarah Lucas, at 7158. In the meantime, VCC has an existing decision making process which will continue to operate until Education Council is fully operational.

VCC has two broadly represented councils. The Academic and Instructional Council, chaired by Dale Dorn, deals essentially with educational approval for courses and programs and is the forum for all debate on educational issues at VCC. All meetings are open to the public. Academic and Instructional Council meets every third Tuesday at 2:00 p.m. VCC Joint Campus Council, chaired by Linda Martin, serves as a forum for discussion and decisions on matters related to operational issues. Membership is representative of all areas and all meetings are open to the public. Joint Campus Council meets

every third Tuesday.

Recommendations from both councils are sent to VCC Council where they are considered, and are referred to the Board with recommendation. VCC Council meetings are open to the public. Faculty and support staff have representative members. The VCC Council meets at the call of the Chair, John Cruickshank, or on as needed basis.

There have been some changes in our Board meetings format which you may find interesting. Firstly, there are <u>no</u> private Board meetings. The only exception is the occasional "In Camera" session where discussion of personnel issues, legal matters or bargaining issues takes place. Otherwise, all Board meetings are open to the public. They are regularly held at 7:00 p.m. on the fourth Thursday evening of the month at alternating campuses. The next Board meeting will be Thursday, November 24, 1994, 7:00 p.m., Room 240 at City Centre Campus.

Our Board operates mainly as a committee as a whole, except for the Finance Committee which meets at the call of the Chair, each month, prior to the Board meeting. These meetings are also public.

The Board, like many other Boards in BC., and indeed in Canada, are currently reviewing Board governance policies, using the Carver Governance Policy model. Several Carver awareness sessions have taken place, and the Board now meets regularly at 5:30 p.m. immediately prior to Board meetings to work on policy development. These sessions are open to the public. Also, the Board has established five subcommittees to work on separate areas of policy development. These groups meet in between Board meetings to develop draft policies for review by all at the 5:30 p.m. sessions.


