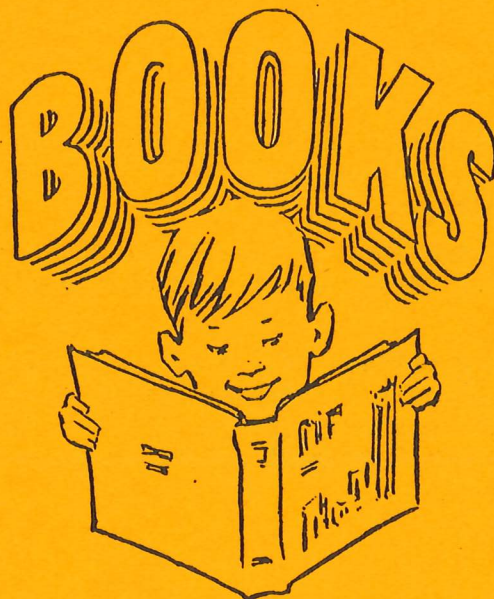
BOOKSTORE NEWS

I'm delighted to advise that we received verbal approval today that Carol Francis, K.E.C. College Foundations student, has been selected to receive a fellowship to attend a symposium on Communications and Culture in Canada. The symposium will be held at the Terry Fox Canadian Youth Centre in Ottawa August 7-19, 1983.

Carol received four-star recommendations from her instructors and the K.E.C. administration. Only 100 fellowships were available throughout Canada. The program is sponsored by the Department of Communications, Government of Canada. Participants meet with leading authorities, take tours and explore such themes as the role of government and the CRTC in the regulation of the broadcast media and the influence of media on society.

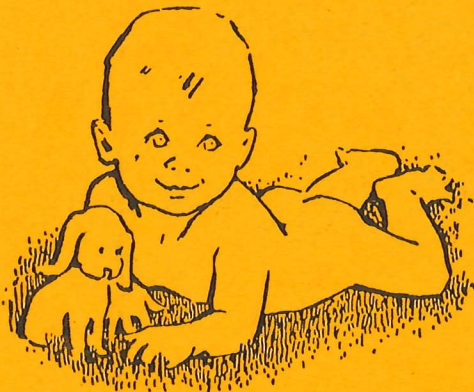
SPIRIT DUPLICATOR

The exact time and place is:


